## **USDA Outlook Forum** sees bright spots on the agriculture horizon

WASHINGTON, D.C. — From long-term to short-term, the USDA Agriculture Outlook Forum focused on the future of agriculture in the US and globally.

It was attended by about 1,600 people from around the world, from farmers to researchers to policy makers. As always, the forum focused on the coming year for agriculture commodities. USDA Chief Economist Robert Johansson said there are not expected to be any large changes in the harvests or prices of most major US crops.

Right now, the primary concern for the global economy is the impact of the coronavirus, but the markets are expected to recover, he said.

Ted McKinney, USDA Trade Undersecretary, said the virus has distracted China from fulfilling the obligations outlined in the first phase of the China-US deal announced in January. He expects that, once the virus is contained, the purchases of US agriculture products will begin, hopefully sometime this spring.

One of the biggest changes predicted is an increase in animal proteins being sent to China. The African Swine Fever in that country has killed more pigs than the rest of the world exports, Johansson said. As a result. China is going to import as much pork as possible from all countries. The US and the EU will likely see the biggest increase in 2019 and that is expected to contin-

It will not be enough to fill the need, he added. Instead, the Chinese people are going to need to rely on other animal protein sources. These additional sales are expected to strengthen the market for poultry and beef and raise prices. Steer and dairy have seen a slight increase in prices. Poultry is down slightly.

At the end of 2019, the Chinese government lifted a ban of US poul-

try that was put in place as a result of the 2014 Bird Flu outbreak. McKinney said the need for more protein likely played a part in why the Chinese finally lifted the ban.

"We talk to private companies in China," McKinney said. "I don't think they're misleading us when they say they value US products."

He said the market is strong, not just for animal protein but other US products.

While US animal protein is expected to do well in the coming year, corn is expect to decline 25 cents per bushel. Soy will be up slightly. Cotton is low now, but a return of normal trading with China might cause an increase in the market price.

In 2019, with record rain falls in parts of the country, flooding prevented the planting of almost 30 million acres of farm land. The prevent-planting and trade tensions caused farmer sentiment to be low, but the announcement of an agriculto surveys, Johannson said.

Debt-to-asset ration remains low, but it is the highest seen in the US since 2003. Farm bankruptcy remains low, but is up a little. Many states remain near a 10-year average bankruptcy rate, but some states are experiencing higher bankruptcy rates.

## A twist on normal apple pie desserts

Need a dessert that is not only delicious but easy to make? Try this recipe for Cinnamon-Apple Crostata. You'll have a hard time waiting to sink your teeth in to the flaky crust with a burst of cinnamon and apples. Find more delicious dessert recipes at Culinary.net.

#### **CINNAMON-APPLE CROSTATA**

Pie Pastry (we used Pillsbury Refrigerated Pie Crusts)

Filling

- 1/2 cup sugar
- 4 tsp. cornstarch
- 2 tsp. cinnamon
- 4 cups peeled and thinly sliced apples (4-5 medium sized)
  - 1 tsp. sugar (for sprinkling)
  - 2 tbs. chopped pecans

Heat oven to 450°.

In medium bowl mix together 1/2 cup sugar, cornstarch and cinnamon. Stir in peeled and sliced apples until well combined.

Place flattened pie crust on an ungreased cookie or pizza sheet.



Spoon apple mixture onto the center of the crust, spreading the mixture to about 2 inches from the edge of the crust.

Fold crust over mixture, pleating along the way.

Brush edges of crust with water.

Sprinkle sugar over crust and apple mixture.

Bake for 15-20 minutes or until crust is a golden brown.

Sprinkle pecans over apple mixture.

Serve with a dollop of whipped cream.

## SKILLET APPLE PIE WITH CARAMEL SAUCE

- 4 large Honeycrisp apples, peeled, cored and sliced
  - 1/4 cup sugar
  - 1 1/2 tablespoons cinnamon, divided
  - 1 tablespoon lemon juice
  - 6 tablespoons butter 1/4 cup, plus 2 teaspoons, brown

sugar

- 2 refrigerated pie crusts
  - 2 teaspoons whipping cream caramel sauce

Heat oven to 350 F.

In large bowl, combine apples, sugar, 1 tablespoon cinnamon and lemon juice until apples are covered. Set

In oven-safe, 10-inch nonstick skillet, melt butter. Add 1/4 cup brown sugar and remaining cinnamon; mix until combined. Boil 5-8 minutes.

In same skillet, place one pie crust over brown sugar mixture. Pour apples over pie crust. Cover apples with second pie crust. Cut slits in top to release steam. Brush whipping cream over crust. Sprinkle with remaining brown sugar.

Bake 35-45 minutes until crust is golden brown.

Drizzle with caramel sauce.

## Michigan tomato farmer was honored by Red Gold

UNION CITY, Mich. — The tomato processor Red Gold, Inc. has given its E.A. Reichart Quality Achievement Award this year to AcMoody Farms.

AcMoody Farms, which operates tomato growing operations in Union City, Coldwater, Mich. and elsewhere in the southwest Michigan area, received the award earlier in February. It's the second time this company. owned and run by Brian and Vern AcMoody, has received the award. AcMoody Farms was one of seven growers in the Red Gold family of growers to win the Red Gold Master Grower award from the company. The E.A. Reichart award is given to one of those seven growers each year. Red Gold currently has 43 growers that produce tomatoes for the company.

"We have three criteria for the award: Quality of production, professionalism, and industry leadership. It's really the whole package," said Red Gold's Senior Director of Agriculture Steve Smith.

Smith said the E.A. Reichart Quality Achievement Award is given to the best of the Master Grower winners. All of the tomatoes grown for Red Gold are for processing, Smith explained. These are Roma type tomatoes. Other kinds of tomatoes, such as Beefsteak, do not hold up well to machine harvesting; those tomatoes are used for the "fresh market."

Co-owner of AcMoody Farms Brian AcMoody said he was honored to be chosen for the award this year.

more marketable.'

"It's certainly a very nice thing to be

picked out of 43 growers, 43 very professional growers in our grower group," he said. "It's very humbling, it's an honor.

"My mom and dad started this farm and I feel we are kind of an extension of them. I also feel that we and the other growers are kind of an extension of Ernie and Fran Reichart, who started Red Gold during World War II."

According to an announcement from the company, Red Gold started in 1942 after the federal government called on everyone to do what they could to aid in the war effort. Since then, Red Gold has become the largest privately-owned tomato processor in the nation, with three facilities: one each in Elwood, Geneva and Orestes, Ind. The company also has a million square foot distribution center in Alexandria, Ind. and operates the RG Transport trucking company out of Elwood. The Red Gold brand can usually be seen on grocery store shelves.

According to AcMoody, the challenges facing tomato growers are much the same as for growers of other crops, namely weather and insect pests. Tomato growers have no genetically modified plants to help with weather and disease challenges, he said. However, at AcMoody Farms at least, all fields are irrigated, so having enough water isn't a problem. The issue with too much rain is that it's a great environment for insect pests. On the other hand, hot dry weather keeps the pests down.

"Give us 85, 86, 87 degrees every day," AcMoody said with a chuckle. "Give us a lot of sunshine and dry weather and we're doing okay."

# Ohio early innovation in growing FFA

COLUMBUS, Ohio — Post-World War I America and her people were ready for progress in the late teens. The war effort had been as intense on the home front as on the front lines. Every American felt the effects of the battle for freedom, and was ready to work for a better day.

The war effort of World War I created a need for more and better food production, improvement in the building trades and a strengthening of family life. This lead to the passage of the Smith-Hughes Act by Congress on Feb.23, 1917. This act provided for vocational training in public schools in the areas of agriculture, home





economics and the building trades.

As the nation's first vocational education legislation, Senators Hoke Smith and Dudley Hughes recognized and funded vocational agriculture courses in secondary schools. Section 10 of the Smith-Hughes act reads, "that such schools shall provide for directed or supervised practice in agriculture, either on a farm provided for by the school or other farm, for at least six months per year."

Soon after the establishment of Vocational Agriculture in 1918, it became apparent that youth activities were to become a part of the program. Groups organized under various names, all over the Nation. Some became quite active and were organized at area and state. One group - "Future Farmers of Virginia", was especially

organizing FFA on a National basis.

Dean Alford Vivian, Dean of the College of Agriculture at The Ohio State University, was interested in the new program and was instrumental in getting it established in Ohio. He persuaded Wilber F. Stewart of Wisconsin to come to The Ohio State University and implement it as supervisor and teacher-trainer. Dr. Stewart was very effective in setting up a quality program and in 1921 became chairman of the teacher education Paulding, Versailles, New Bremen, department. Ray Fife, his assistant, became head state supervisor.

Vocational Agriculture enjoyed

well organized and instrumental in great acceptance from schools and communities from the very beginning. The new educational concept of "Learning by Doing" was practical and effective. The teachers' interest and participation in the activities of the community were appreciated. The "Ag Room" soon became a popular place in the community and the program grew.

Ohio was an early innovator. The Vocational Agriculture chapters in Ohio were created on April 20, 1929. They included: Fayette, Hebrow, Worthington, Bellefontaine, Painesville, Harmony Township,



Berlin, Medina, Hillsboro, Liverpool Township, Wooster, Gibsonburg, Montgomery Township, Wadsworth, Millersburg and Pleasant Township.

Versailles. Ohio (then under the leadership of A.W. Nisonger) was one of those 19 communities and is still strong to this day as an FFA chapter at Versailles High School.

Leading the Versailles FFA charge is school advisor Dena Wuebker.

"Our membership expectations are set quite high as we want the kids to perform three or four community service activities throughout the year," Wuebker said, "and we provide them with many activities to choose from, like our annual toy drive, can food drive, harvest sale and farm safety training just to name a few.

"It's our belief that FFA helps develop lifetime skills in kids, things like leadership, communication, personal growth, teamwork and interviewing skills."

Talawanda Schools in Oxford, Ohio is the third-oldest FFA program in the state. The program at the high school began in 1957. More than 200 students at this school take ag-only classes.

"Our FFA students can choose from five different areas of concentration food and natural resources, greenhouse management, livestock selection care, mechanical principles and ag business," said Mike Derringer, ag education teacher. "The community is very supportive of FFA at the high school."

Kellie Beiser, ag education teacher at Edgewood High School and Butler Tech in Butler County, says FFA "opens the students' doors and their minds."

"A lot of students in our community would never consider ag as a career because they're not from a farm anymore," Beiser said. "Thanks to FFA they're making connections to work, volunteer and intern. FFA is more than just one thing. It's opening doors to the industry and in our community that's highly important."



### Missouri Weekly Hay Summary Week ending 2/21/2020

Although there was still some left-over snow in the north early week for the first week in quite a while there was no new winter weather this week. Mud is still a problem especially in the afternoons. With February quickly passing many are now taking counts of inventory on hand and starting to make plans for fertilizer and spring work for the upcoming growing season. Hay movement is slow. The supply of hay is moderate, demand is light to moderate, and prices are steady. The Missouri Department of Agriculture has a hay directory available for both buyers and sellers. 

my home county was the castor bean and castor oil capital of the U.S. Both titles, however, slipped into irrelevance as a new resource, crude oil, rose

to dominate the lubricant business. Today, fewer and fewer Americans have ever heard of castor beans or castor oil.

Those long-forgotten twins seem to have a modern equivalent. Total U.S. wheat acres peaked at 88 million in 1981. Last year, the most recently completed reporting year, total U.S. wheat acres were about one-half of that, or 45.6 million acres.

In its just-published "Agricultural Projections to 2029," however, the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) forecasts wheat's decades-long slide will stabilize between 45 million and 46.5 million acres in the coming decade. That estimate also comes with a warning: "U.S. [wheat] export growth is tempered by sustained price competition from Russia, Ukraine, and the European Union."

Translation: After 40 years of falling U.S. wheat plantings and, now, fast-rising international competition for exports, don't bet on our forecast.

It's no surprise that the two biggest benefactors of wheat's decline are America's two biggest crops, corn and soybeans. As David Widmar of Agricultural Economic Insights pointed out more than two years ago, almost 30 million of wheat's lost 43 million acres have been planted to corn and soybeans since 2000.

There are two critical (among other) reasons for the big switch: government ethanol blending mandates have fueled corn's rise and fast-growing soy exports, especially to China, have pushed soybean acres higher.

Both forces, however, are losing steam. Increased use of electric cars and, soon, trucks, has already flat-lined the once voracious U.S. gasoline—and, in turn, ethanol—appetite and continued global competition in the soy trade is pinching U.S. soybean margins towards breakeven.

The elective, sustained tariff war with America's biggest soybean customer, China, throughout 2018 and 2019 has added to that

More troubling for U.S. farmers is the unabated growth of their soy competitors, especially South America's biggest soy boy, Brazil. Late last year, USDA's Foreign Agricultural Service noted that for the first time ever, "Brazil is forecast to overtake the United States as the leading soybean producer in the world during the 2019/20 season."

Part of the explanation is American; 2019's terrible weather clipped U.S. soybeans harvest nearly 20 percent. Another part, though, is Brazil's strong and steady rise in plantings.

Last July, the Brazilian Ministry of Agriculture forecast the nation's soybean acreage would balloon 25 percent in the coming decade. If accurate, the increase of 23.5 million acres

## Phase 1 benefits between US and China questioned

Trade is becoming less optimistic on the benefits of the Phase 1 trade agreement between the US and China. The US has not seen a build in Chinese demand

since the agreement was signed over a month ago. Other sources are offering commodities

reduced values to the US, and verbiage in the agreement allows China to make purchases from other sellers when this happens. While China will likely resume US imports at some point, it is possible yearly demand could fall short of initial projections.

The announcement that China would scale back its tariffs on US soybeans failed to offer the market much support either. This is because the roll back only covered half of the tariff that was imposed in September, leaving a rate of 27.5% in effect. At the present time this makes soybeans from the US into China \$2.40 more than Brazil's. Even without this tariff, Brazilian soybeans are being offered at a 15 to 40 cent discount to the US to other buyers.

The US livestock industry has been hoping to see elevated demand from China, but actual Chinese buying may end up being less than hoped for. Meatpacker JBS has signed an agreement to provide China with \$717 million of beef, pork, and poultry on an annual basis. This meat will all be sourced from Brazil, however, with shipments starting in the next two months. China is still likely to need meat imports from the US, but this news is concerning given the trade pact that was just signed.

Concerns are building over the massive supply of pork in the United States. We are seeing near record volumes of pork exports, but these are failing to consume all of the hogs that are being processed. Last week's US hog slaughter was reported at 2.7 million head. This is 9 1/2% more than a year ago at this time. Some economists are fearful that even if China starts making imports in earnest, we will see our pork supply continue to rise at this rate.

One benefit the US corn market has right now is a lack of competition in the global market. This is especially from South America where attention has shifted to soybean harvest and exports. The only other real source of competition in the global market right now is Ukraine, who is exporting more corn than the US for the time being. This window of opportunity for US corn sales may be narrow, which is limiting market response from what

A topic in the market that is only expected to grow in its impact is the quality of the US corn supply. While high moisture is being reported, the greatest concern is from high levels of foreign material, or FM. A large amount of corn needed to be commercial dried this year which tends to make kernels more fragile, and prone to breaking. This then creates FM and fines that buyers are not willing to pay a premium for. That said, we have seen a rise in corn demand even with quality issues

as importers have few other sources to US Ag industry. Final data for 2019 choose from at this point.

The real concern with corn quality may be in front of us, however. Temperatures have been cold enough that fungus has not been able to grow. This will likely change once temperatures warm, especially with the moisture of corn being higher than average. Reports of stored corn taking on moisture after being dried are also a factor to contend with.

Data shows the ongoing poor economics are taking their toll on the

shows that 590 farmers across the US filed Chapter 12 bankruptcy. This is up 100 filings from 2018 and the most since 2011. There are hopes that recent trade deals will start to turn the US farm economy around, but these will depend heavily upon the fallout from the Coronavirus in China and what it does to global commodity demand.

situation. For this coming year the baseline data indicates US corn acres at 94.5 million and a yield of 178.5 bushels per acre. Sovbean acres are forecast at 84 million with an average US yield of 50.5 bpa. Ending stocks for next year

are forecast to increase on both crops, coming in at 2.75 billion bu on corn and 518 million bu on soybeans.

The USDA is also forecasting the world market share of US corn to decrease from 29.5% last year to 29% this year and then rebound to 30% for the next five years. The US share of the world soybean market is expected to range from 34% to 35% as competition from

the market on wheat is forecast to hold between 12% and 13% over this time. Cash values on all three are expected to hold near today's levels for the next decade according to USDA forecasters.

would boost Brazilian soy acres to 112 million by 2029, or about 22 million acres more than the record U.S. soy plantings in 2017.

A few days after that news hit global markets, Reuters reported

that the chairman of China's largest food company, state-owned COFCO International, told Brazilian ag leaders that his firm wanted to increase its Brazilian soy imports by 25 percent over the next five years. More troubling, the COFCO boss added that his company would underwrite soy expansion on some or most of Brazil's undeveloped 25 million hectares.

How many acres are in 25 million

hectares? You better sit down for this: a staggering 61.8 million.

That number and the Chinese promise should finally dispel another myth too long at the center of U.S. agricultural geography: Buy land because they're not making it anymore.

Well, "they" are making more of it and many of those makers—Brazil, Ukraine, Russia, China among others—are poised to substantially alter American farm and food geography in the next 20 years.

In fact, they already are; just ask a wheat grower.

If you can find one.

## FFA at the junior high level in Ohio is alive and well

TRENTON, Ohio — There were two banners sporting quite compelling messages at last year's FFA National Convention in Indianapolis in November. The first one read: "One is never too old to learn." The other read: "One is never too young to START learning."

Today, there are 24,800 FFA members in 308 chapters across Ohio alone for students in grades nine through 12. While FFA enrollment has enjoyed enormous success the past decade, those at the National FFA Headquarters in Indianapolis, Indiana are taking aim at those in grades 6-8.

"Even when it comes to FFA, one is never too young to begin learning about agriculture," said Kolesen McCoy, an agribusiness and applied economics major at Ohio State University who was elected FFA National President at the convention in November.


FFA promoters have strongly targeted those in grades 6-8 the past five years. The tally to this point shows that there are 21 schools in Ohio offering FFA at the sixth grade level. There are 514 schools nationwide offering FFA to seventhgraders and 1,012 at the eighth grade level.

Attempting to reach those at a lower grade level is nothing new. According to the Journal of Ag Education, the earliest reported eighth grade FFA program was formed in Virginia in 1926. Seventh grade FFA programs began in Vermont in 1930. Louisiana had its first FFA program for seventh graders in 1960. Sixth grade programs started in Mississippi in 1974.

Ohio spearheaded the FFA junior high efforts in 1988, realizing it was never too early to teach youth about the importance of agriculture.

Rosemarie Rosetti, a former assistant professor in the Ohio State University Department of Agriculture Education, issued a status report on middle grade agricultural education and FFA programs in the United States in the mid-1980s. She also issued some strong recommendations to those in her state.

"Beginning in kindergarten and continuing through twelfth grade, all students should receive some systematic instruction about agriculture," Rosetti wrote. "The intent of this recommendation was to aid our society in becoming more literate about agriculture. Agricultural literacy suggests that a person understands the food and fiber system, including its history and current economic, social and environmental significance."

FFA enrollment in the high school level steadily declined between 1977 and 1991. In 1977, FFA membership was at 509,735 and it had dropped to 383,450 by 1991, a decline of 24.8 percent. In 1988, a constitutional amendment was passed at the National FFA Convention that officially allowed middle school aged youth membership into the organization.

"Allowing FFA at the middle school level showed a drastic increase in FFA members by the 1992-93 school year as enrollment increased to 417,462," Rosetti said. "By this time, 36 states had middle school FFA programs and enrolled 52,968 members nationwide."

At the middle school level, the top FFA topics are plant science, career exploration, agricultural literacy, animal science and conservation. The next five are mathematics, agricultural mechanics, soil science, public speaking and human relations.

While competitions among FFA chapters are normally held at the high school level, junior high competitions are becoming the norm nowadays. Four states held

## SGD offers free warm germ testing for Corn Belt farmers

JEFFERSONVILLE, Ohio — In 2018, soybean production was notably the worst quality in 40 years. Many companies threw every fungicide possible at their beans to achieve warm germ tests above 85 percent.

But unprecedented amounts of rain prevented planting and no-return policies meant farmers were not able to return treated soybeans to their seed companies. This meant farmers were stuck with subpar beans.

of Seed Genetics Direct (SGD) in Jeffersonville, Ohio, wants to give farmers in the Corn Belt a much needed lift. Jeffries is offering free warm germ testing to Corn Belt farmers through March 15.

"We worked hard to move seed for 95 percent of our customers, but we know other farmers have carry-over beans that were left in barns with high humidity and high temperatures," Jeffries said. "This carry-over seed was definitely not in a controlled environment. So, whether a Seed Genetics customer or not, we want to help and will germ test beans for any farmers in need."

A warm germ test is a standard test that is done under ideal conditions in a lab and tells one what percentage of that seed will germinate.

"With soybeans it's very typical for companies to label their beans at 90 percent, even though they're actually 95 or 96 percent," Jeffries said. "If you plant 200,000 seeds under ideal conditions one should have 180,000 final stand, but normally that doesn't happen as things are never perfect."

"In 2018 we had a terrible harvest and seed quality on soybeans was very poor," Jeffries said. "We had a lot of pod and stem blight and because of the delayed harvest with high moisture with high humidity we saw a lot of that pod and stem blight.

"In 2019 many had treated seeds in their barn and most companies won't take back treated soybeans. Our policy is normally the same, but last year SGD did take treated soybeans back and

Chris Jeffries, president and founder was able to help those farmers who were though they've been treated, the seed double-cropping."

> According to Jeffries, a lot of farmers will take 200 seeds, put them on a wet paper towel and see how many seeds will germinate.

> "It's an old accepted way of doing things," Jeffries said, "but the problem is when we send these seeds to Indiana Crop Improvement they have trained technicians who will say the sprouting doesn't count as the embryo has been injured."

> Jeffries says he started this program because farmers need to know what they're planting.

"If they're planting seeds this year from the 2019 harvest they're likely in excellent shape, but if they're planting seeds harvested in 2018, and even 0073.

quality may not be there and they're in for a huge surprise. And if they're not careful they'll be planting seeds twice."

Chris Jeffries and his brother, Todd, are willing to offer free germ testing as long as farmers send two-and-ahalf pounds of their seed with tags by March 15 to SGD at 9983 Jefferson-West Lancaster Road, P.O. Box 32, Jeffersonville, Ohio 43128. SGD will work with Indiana Crop Improvement or Ohio Crop Improvement to test the seed germ.

"We're hoping people will see what we're doing and someday do business with us," Jeffries said.



## Education, innovation, networking: Ohio Pork Congress

COLUMBUS, Ohio — Innovation and education. Those two words may best describe the thrust of this year's Ohio Pork Congress held in Columbus, Ohio earlier this month.

The two-day Ohio Pork Congress attracted more than 450 attendees and 72 trade show exhibitors for educating, networking and honoring its members.

"Each year, Ohio's pork producers have the opportunity to learn from industry professionals about innovative products and methods to positively impact their farming operations," said Ohio Pork Council President Dave Shoup. "Thanks to our panel of speakers and trade show exhibitors, attendees of Ohio Pork Congress gained valuable information that can be implemented in their daily profession."

Shoup said this year's Ohio Pork Congress offered the opportunity to reflect on accomplishments, review lessons learned in the past year, and look to the future for opportunities to enhance Ohio's pork industry.

On day one, the Employee Symposium featured industry professionals sharing perspectives on pork industry work culture and attracting employees. Guest speakers included Scott Caine of Aimpoint Research and Jonathon Hoek, Kasey Sheldon and Valerie Duttlinger of Summit SmartFarms. Later that evening, the live auction and reception generated more than \$26,000 to benefit non-checkoff activities.

Caine spoke about what the next generation of pork producers will look like while the other three spoke about creating an irresistible place to work for that next generation.

Day two topics ranged from watershed-local to international in scale, and Shoup weighed in.

"The governor's H2Ohio plan has allocated money to farmers to allow them to adopt different practices to clean up the water in Lake Erie through the Maumee Watershed," Shoup said. "We also spoke about the Ohio Agricultural Conservation Initiative, a voluntary program where environmental groups and farmers come together and work on a plan on how to implement that money in the best possible way. We're also trying to understand the practices farmers are using through an app that is being developed so that at the end of the next two or three years we can see what advancements have been made."

The coronavirus topic was looming at this year's gathering; something that

Shoup says should gain producers' attention.

"Our hearts go out to the people of China as they are dealing with this coronavirus and we sure hope that disease does not go pandemic," Shoup said. "That has sure had a direct impact on our swine producers' markets. There has been some real excitement about the USMCA and what that could do for swine markets moving forward. One of our fears is how African swine fever has just decimated the industry in China. It will be difficult to clean things up and re-establish the swine industry there. It looks like it will very rapidly modernize their industry. We just pray it doesn't come to our country and that we are properly prepared if it

Keynote speaker this year was Henry Zerby of Wendy's Quality Supply Chain Co-op Inc. Zerby provided insights on the global protein supply.

As with each Ohio Pork Congress, certain producers were recognized for their efforts in this industry.

The Pork Industry Excellence Award went to Jim Heimerl of Johnstown, Ohio. Heimerl is a former National Pork Producers president, serving from 2018 to 2019, and was president of the Ohio Pork Council in 2013. Heimerl played an essential role in the signing of the 2018 farm bill, trade deals with Canada, Argentina, Mexico and Columbia.

Swine Manager of the Year Award went to Bill Knapke of Mercer County. Knapke is environmental manager for Cooper Farms. This award is given to the individual who is highly knowledgeable of the pork industry and has demonstrated the ability to make key decisions on behalf of their operations.

Knapke has written numerous nutrient management plans for the farms in northwest Ohio to ensure that the environment and local water supplies are protected for generations to come.

The OPC Service Award was presented to Tony Nye of Ohio State University Extension. Nye, the agriculture natural resources director for OSU in Clinton County, has been actively involved the past 31 years. He, along with other Extension educators in the state, founded the Extension's swine educator team which deals with production systems, nutrition and

health, swine mortality, composting, ventilation and Pork Quality Assurance. Nye was an assistant swine superintendent at the Ohio State Fair from 1985-2018.

The Friends of Ohio Pork Award was presented to Dr. Andrew Bowman of the Ohio State University Department of Veterinary Medicine. Bowman's expertise is in swine production medicine, veterinary public health and epidemiology. Bowman has educated hundreds of youth about the

importance of biosecurity practices and raising awareness about infectious diseases in pigs and people.

Pork Promoter of the Year Award went to the Morrow County Pork Producers. In the past 41 years, the Morrow County Pork Producers have raised more than \$300,000 for the Building Fund Pig project and they've donated supplies and a pit for a youth to exhibit at the county fair. The group is highly known for its contributions to the youth and community members.

## The downsides of genetic testing in White's novel


"Salt River: A Doc Novel" Randy Wayne White c.2020, Putnam, \$27.00, 368 pages

You just spit in a tube.

That's what you do when you have your DNA sequenced: spit, cap it tight, ship

it off, and wait. A few weeks later, you'll know where your ancestors lived. You'll have an explanation for your red hair or long fingers. You'll see the world differently. Or, as in the new



Twenty-odd years ago, back when Tomlinson was a hungry young man, he seized upon what he thought was an easy way to make a buck: he donated to a for-profit sperm bank. Now that youthful decision had come back to haunt him, in the form of several adult children he never knew he had - each one hoping to meet their biological father.

There were, as Tomlinson's best friend Marion "Doc" Ford pointed out, downsides to genetic testing.

The biggest one was that Tomlinson was find-able and one of his children, Delia, had come to Sanibel Island, asking questions.

She was smart, as Ford could tell, but she was nosing around in the wrong place for answers that she might never get. What's worse: she practically led her half-siblings to Tomlinson's door, and to Sanibel, where it was easy to get into trouble if you weren't careful enough.

Doc Ford knew all about that, too.


Ithadn't been long since he'd returned to Sanibel from the Bahamas, where Jimmy Jones, a "shrewd operator," had hidden millions of dollars in shipwrecked gold that the government. divers, and archaeologists all wanted to find. Ford didn't know where Jimmy was or whether he was even alive, but he knew where the gold was stashed. Some of it, in fact, was hidden in a buoy beneath Ford's houseboat - a little secret that he hoped the thieves who'd kill for it would never learn...

So, here's the thing: "Salt River" is a thriller-not-thriller.

It's clever, times two. Author Randy Wayne White's Doc Ford spins a double scam in this story and it's a plot line readers (and fans!) will love because it's... well, no spoilers here. It's good because Tomlinson has a large part in this book and he's a generally likable guy. This book sews up a seam that ripped in past books - don't worry, you'll catch up quick enough, if you're not a regular Ford-novel reader - and it leaves another tear in a different spot that's made for more Ford.

But thrilling? Not so much. There's action in "Salt River," but it's not a leap-out-of-your-seat kind of thrill; it's more like a sink-in-your-chairand-enjoy kind of novel with enough high-tide danger, intrigue, and action to keep you reading. With guns and sharks but little-to-no profanity or sexplicit scenes, you could almost call it Heart-Pounding Light.

For readers who like mile-a-minute novels but want something just a tad gentler for once, this one's what you need to find. Of course, mysterythrillers are what you love, and "Salt River" is the spittin' image.





## Start thinking about Canada geese management now

Canada geese begin scouting for nesting areas in February, and now is when goose management techniques should begin.
Canada geese prefer to nest near water bodies surrounded by short, mowed grass offering a clear line of sight to look for potential predators.

Fortunately, implementing harassment techniques, installing fencing or other barriers, and the avoidance of

feeding geese can prevent unwanted nesting on your property. For more information on the practices and how to do them, visit the website https://www.in.gov/dnr/fishwild/3002.htm

A permit is not required to harass geese if they are not physically harmed. If necessary, nests without eggs, hatchlings or young birds can be removed at any time without a permit.



Another challenge for AcMoody Farms is farm labor, although AcMoody said his farm has been lucky in that its farm labor has been relatively stable. The farm hires 15-20 largely Hispanic migrant laborers every season; some of these workers have been with the company for as long as 17 years.



## Bloomberg comments don't sit well with farmers


HILLSBORO, Ohio — Michael Bloomberg is said to have short legs, but there are many who believe the U.S. Presidential candidate can still insert a foot into his mouth.

Comments made by Bloomberg two years ago about farmers is resonating today and causing a fire storm, not only among the other presidential candidates but those in agriculture as well:

Bloomberg, Nov. 17, 2016: If you think about it, the agrarian society lasted 3,000 years, and we can teach processes. I can teach anybody - even people in this room, so no offense intended – to be a farmer. It's a process. You dig a hole, you put a seed in, you put dirt on top, you add water, up comes corn. You can learn that. Then you had 300 years of the industrial society. You put the piece of metal on the lathe, you turn the crank in direction of arrow and you can have a job. And we created a lot of jobs. At one point, 98 percent of the world worked in agriculture. Today it's 2% of the United States.

The viral 58-second clip, seen more than 3.5 million times on Twitter alone since Friday, Feb. 14, was lifted from a 2016 appearance at the University of Oxford in England in which Bloomberg, speaking to a group at the Said Business School.

Kevin Sheekey, Bloomberg's campaign manager, complains that the remarks were taken out of context and exploited by his rivals, specifically Democratic presidential

front-runner Senator Bernie Sanders of Vermont. In a statement, Sheekey pointed out that the clip leaves off "Mike's first sentence where he is referring to agrarian society that lasted 3,000 years, not farmers

in 2016 came about after he was first asked how the United States should address income inequality. Then, Bloomberg talked about educational inequality. This all led to the comments about farmers, which led to tweets and comments by celebrities and farmers alike.

In a Tweet, Donald Trump "Bloomberg wrote: wouldn't last three seconds as a farmer, but like his comments on minorities, you can tell he really hates regular hardworking Americans."

Charlie Daniels Tweeted: "He will never fight for them because he couldn't care less about them."

Tribune Chicago columnist John Kass wrote: "Bloomburg: mocking American farmers is no way to unify the country. He might as well have called them deplorable rubes."

The backlash on social media was swift, just as it was among many farmers across the Buckeye State.

"Mr. Bloomberg may have a lot of money and know a lot about many things, but when it comes to farming he

has no idea what we do nor how long it takes to do these jobs," said Dale Anderson, corn and soybean farmer in Ross County in Ohio. "The general public hasn't a clue to knowing all the tasks we perform on the farm and

Bloomberg's comments it's much, much more than planting a seed and covering it with soil."

> "It's quite obvious he knows little about agriculture and that's sad," Caldwell said. "Too many politicians claim to know a lot about every occupation, but in agriculture he's clueless."

> Such a political gaffe by Bloomberg could haunt him through November's election. Bloomberg's elitist faming comments could be the Hillary Clinton 'Deplorables' moment that poses the biggest threat to his campaign.

## Rural life examined in **Smithsonian exhibit**

BRISTOL, Ind. — A colorful, interactive display of rural life past and present is moving across the nation.

Artwork and photographs in the sprawling exhibit belonging to the Smithsonian Institute provide just a sampling of the experience on farms and in small towns.

There are videos of people sharing what they enjoy about living in a small community, the challenges they faced as times changed and why they chose to stay as the population shifted more to cities.

Why efforts to revitalize those areas matter to folks who stayed, left and will be there in the future and what the years ahead might bring are also part of the exhibit.

"Crossroads: Change in Rural America" is presently at Elkhart County Historical Museum in Indiana and Wolf Gap Education Outreach in Pulaski, Tennessee until March 15.

One purpose of the exhibit is showing there's more to rural America than decline to combat a misconception created by hardships often reported in the news.

"Many Americans consider rural communities to be endangered and hanging on by a thread suffering from brain drain, inadequate schools and a barren, overused landscape. There is much more to the story of rural America," the Smithsonian Institute wrote on its website about the exhibit

Julie Parke, director of the Elkhart County Historical Museum, said the exhibit has broadened what she already knew from growing up with friends on farms and being involved in 4-H in nearby Kosciusko County.

Parke said several local farm families talking about their experiences and responding to questions from participants were included to give the exhibit there more of a personal touch. "It's a nice way to tie the people of our community to the story that's being told," she said.

The exhibit has been up at both locations since Feb. 1. The one in Elkhart County is inside the gymnasium of an old school erected in 1903 at Bristol, a community with a population of 1,600 in the northern part of the state. Parke said more than 300 people viewed the exhibit the first two weeks when February attendance at the museum is normally half as much for the entire month.

The exhibit comes in six sections. The first two sections feature a great deal of still and moving images along with actual recordings of wind, tractors and other typical sounds from rural areas. One section entitled "Perseverance" includes videos of residents talking about their love for small town living and why those who left might return.

The exhibit also illustrates how rural communities adjusted when manufacturing began taking root, how farmers turned to those jobs to survive tough times in agriculture and resentment of food producers feeling invaded by the presence of industry.

Parke said the exhibit provides a more accurate reflection of small town life than what's often depicted in the media while giving people from rural areas a deeper sense of appreciation. "We think it gets people talking about these ideas that make for a great sense of pride in our community but it also helps be mindful of not taking all of that for granted," she said.

The exhibit will next be at the Historic Summerville Train Depot in Summerville, Georgia and the Museum of Rexburg in Rexburg, Idaho from March 6 through April

The exhibit will also be at the North Manchester Center for History in North Manchester, Indiana; the Presque Isle District Library in Rogers City, Michigan and the Arts in McNairy in Selmer, Tennessee from March 21 through May 2.

According to the Smithsonian Institute, the exhibit also illustrates how small towns despite hurdles along the way continue looking hard for new opportunities to develop and grow.

## Michigan appeals to USDA for help with asparagus

LANSING, Mich. — Members of Congress from Michigan are going to bat for producers of asparagus in the state feeling sabotaged financially by cheap imports. USDA is being asked to purchase 3.5 million pounds of processed asparagus from Michigan farmers prior to the April harvest season to make up for market share lost to countries like Peru and Mexico selling asparagus in U.S. for less than what it costs to produce here.

Michigan is the largest U.S producer at more than 23 million pounds of asparagus harvested in 2018, according to the National Agricultural Statistics Service under USDA. "The influx of processed asparagus from Peru took over many of the contracts typically filled by domestic producers, causing domestic asparagus intended for processing to be diverted to the fresh market or to not be harvested at all," said Debbie Stabenow and Gary Peters, the two U.S senators from the state in a joint letter to USDA secretary Sonny Perdue.

Huizenga cited what he called questionable foreign trade practices for longstanding growers of asparagus in Michigan and the U.S. losing sales and receiving less money for their crop. As a result, Huizenga said many growers in 2019 did not harvest their fields, complete their harvest or diverted their crop to other markets to minimize losses. "This sudden change in the market is a critical threat for growers in the shortterm as well as for the long-term viability

of the domestic asparagus production in the U.S.," Huizenga said in his letter to Perdue. According to USDA, the share of U.S asparagus consumption through imports exploded from 10.8-percent in 1980 to 91.2-percent in 2015. It's estimated asparagus from Mexico accounts for 55-percent of all asparagus in U.S stores.

The federal lawmakers said USDA purchasing the asparagus would provide critical relief for both the processed and fresh asparagus industry by raising prices. Growers are hoping for a decision from USDA by mid-March. "USDA has been very responsive to the asparagus industry's request and the bonus buy request is moving forward," said Dawn Drake, general manager of the Michigan Cooperative Marketing Agricultural Association.



USDA is being asked to make the purchase with its Section 32 funding already used to make \$400 million in livestock, fruit and vegetables annually to support pricing.

Bill Knudson, an agricultural economist at Michigan State University, said interest in USDA buying commodities has increased in a lot of areas and there could be a market in areas like school lunch programs for USDA purchased asparagus. "Asparagus is pretty healthy food and I think it has some potential to find a market either in school lunches or some other type of food distribution type programs for people having a hard time paying for food," Knudson stated.

competitions at the sixth grade level this past year. Fourteen states held competition at the seventh grade level, whereas 17 states held competition at the eighth grade level. Those areas of competition include livestock judging, public speaking, crops, livestock showing, meats, horse judging, agricultural mechanics, agricultural science fair and dairy foods.

"Most state FFA executive secretaries indicate that middle school programs were beneficial to the students as well as to the states," Rosetti said. "Students were more aware about agriculture and more informed about careers in agriculture. The students benefited from the hands-on experience in

the classrooms and felt that these programs were a boost to secondary school enrollment."

In 2017, the Talawanda High School FFA in Oxford, Ohio partnered with Talawanda Middle School to start an after-school program for those in grades 6-8 who have an interest in agriculture. High school advisers met with students once a month and averaged 30 students per meeting. The group is still going strong with topics of food science, animal science, meat science, small engines, greenhouses and plant science.

Versailles High School in Darke County in Ohio has been in existence since 1935. The chapter has offered FFA for eighth graders the past nine years. There were 16 members in 2011. There were 34 members last

# After 2020 positive trend in ag tractor sales forecasted

MILWAUKEE, Wis. — Industry analysts are forecasting a positive trend in agricultural tractor and self-propelled combine sales for the next several years, with the recently-passed USMA's Phase One bolstering the soybean market and overall capital expenditures.

That's according to new data from the Assoc. of Equipment Manufacturers (AEM) and Oxford Economics, which added the slight downturn in sales this year will rebound in 2021.


"Bad weather, trade protectionism and slower growth around the globe were the main impediments to further growth in 2019," said Benjamin Duyck, AEM market intelligence director. "Future global slowdowns could reduce food production, putting downward pressure on farmers' incomes.

"Escalation in the U.S.-China trade dispute could also cause concerns for ag equipment manufacturers," he added. "However, despite its limited scope, the recently-passed Phase One deal should provide relief, both for the soybean market, as well as overall capital expenditures."


In 2019, the U.S.'s agricultural mechanization sector grew a better-than-expected 3.2 percent to \$15.6 billion, added Duyck, citing Oxford Economics data.

According to Oxford Economics, the agricultural machinery industry is looking at

# Impact of the 2019 growing season on Lake Erie algae

COLUMBUS, Ohio—Heidelberg University has been monitoring Maumee River water, which flows into Lake Erie, for 45 years. Last April, something weird was going on which could affect harmful algal blooms (HABs). It will be a topic for discussion at the March 3-4 Conservation Tillage and Technology Conference in Ada.

When Laura Johnson, director of the National Center for Water Quality Research at Heidelberg, started looking at the numbers, she was puzzled.

"We were getting a lot of storm events," Johnson said. "Looking at the raw data, the (phosphorus) concentrations weren't getting as high as they normally do during storm events. Typically, every summer, the dissolved phosphorus (DRP) concentration increases, and then it comes back down."

Something is weird, Johnson told a colleague. Particulate phosphorus was high because the rain caused plenty of erosion, but the DRP was lower than expected.

Particulate phosphorus is phosphorus associated with the soil particles, Johnson said. DRP is the phosphorous that one can't see, but it is easy for algae to use because it's like the "sugar" of the phosphorous world. "Flow was high; particulate phosphorous was still really high because we had plenty of erosion," Johnson said. "But the dissolved

phosphorous was lower than expected. This information might be important. Our forecasting has been biased towards dissolved phosphorous.

Based on flow, researchers expected last year's bloom to be around 10 on a scale of 1 to 10. Instead, it was from 7 to 7.5. Still high, but not as high as expected, Johnson said.

Meanwhile, Greg LaBarge, Ohio State University Extension field specialist, did some surveys. He found that much less fertilizer was applied in the region from October 2018 through the end of May 2019.

"A lot less nutrient went on the soil," LaBarge said. "Some of our ag practices, such as fertilizer application, even crop reduction had to be a part of that reduction we saw in DRP. But we still had enough phosphorous going down that there was a significant bloom."

This indicates that there's still phosphorous available in the soil, in addition to phosphorus stored in ditches, stream banks, the whole watershed system, which ends up in Lake Erie.

"It is going to take other practices than just thinking about nutrient management," LaBarge said. "We need to think about water management practices; drainage water management, filtering phosphorus out of the water at the edge of field, wetlands and other practices that change the water leaving fields."

a down year for 2020; however, they forecast that slip will turn back around for 2021, an AEM statement read.

Overall, their most likely scenario of a 2.5 percent drop looks to be just a one-year event and not the start of a trend. Projected 1-2 percent annual growth over the following years would put manufacturers more than 2 percent above their 2019 performance by 2023, the analysts said in a Feb. 14 statement.

Oxford Economics added the worstcase scenario is an escalation in global protectionism, which they said has a 20-percent probability. In that scenario, agricultural equipment sales would slide for each of the next four years, with 2023 sales being more than 6 percent lower than 2019.

"However, they also assign a 15-percent probability of expanded growth occurring if global governments ramp down trade tensions, cutting 2020's forecast loss in half and putting 2023's performance more than 5 percent above 2019," the statement read.

While all forecast models show a drop in 2020 of varying sizes, Oxford Economics and Duyck said the chances are better than not that the mediumterm trend will be positive.

"With the USMCA having passed in Washington and the Phase One agreement struck by President Trump and Chinese President Xi, we believe one of the more positive scenarios to be increasingly likely," Duyck said.

"While some of the environmental and global economic concerns remain question marks, the trade concerns that were modeled into some versions of the forecast seem to be relaxing," he added.

In another AEM report, January 2020 saw mixed results in overall U.S. sales of tractors and self-propelled combines, with total farm tractor sales growing, compared to January 2019, while combines fell by a quarter.

U.S. total farm tractor sales increased 4.7 percent in January, compared to last year, while U.S. January self-propelled combine sales fell 24.4 percent. The report added total U.S. sales of 2WD tractors grew in all segments in January, a total of 4.9 percent, compared to January 2019.

In addition, under-40 horsepower 2WD tractors were up 2.6 percent, and sales of 40-100 horsepower tractors went up 4.6 percent, while sales of 100-plus horsepower tractors led the way with 19.6 percent growth to 1,361 units. Total November 2019 U.S. 4WD tractor sales fell 6.6 percent to 169 units sold.

For Canada, November 2019 4WD tractor sales fell 84.1 percent (from 69 to 11 units sold year-over-year), and self-propelled combine sales notched down 22 percent.

Moreover, November 2019 2WD Canadian sales were down over all 2.8 percent, with the 40 horsepower segment growing 11.9 percent, while the 40-100 horsepower segment fell 18.2 percent, and the 100-plus horsepower segment fell 28.6 percent.

"The sales numbers we are seeing for January 2020 are in line with our expectations," said Curt Blades, AEM senior vice president of agricultural services.

"With the approval of the USMCA and the announcement of the Phase One trade agreement between the U.S. and China, we believe we are seeing some positive trends on the horizon for ag equipment sales."

Mark Killion, director of U.S. Industries for Oxford Economics, told Farm World North American production of agricultural machinery was buffeted in 2019 by volatile trade relations and difficult farm growing conditions.

"Output of equipment for use in agriculture stalled as a result, with very little growth seen in the final months of 2019 and the start of 2020," he said. "This leaves the level of outputleaving-output in January 2020 some 3.5 percent lower currently than was seen in early 2019.

"However, we forecast output and sales of equipment to see renewed growth over the course of 2020-21," he added, agreeing with AEM and Oxford Economics' new data.

"After getting past the lingering softness in the first quarter this year, a nascent recovery in farm incomes is expected for 2020, which, along with increased confidence from implementation of the USMCA and progress on trade negotiations with China, should boost output of agricultural equipment over 2021-22."

# his auction tale is no bul

people used to call me a big bull shipper. At least that's what I thought they were saying. The reputation was well earned because I used to buy a lot of bulls every year for friends and customers. I worked bull sales all over the country as a ring man It's the Pitts and I was the announcer By Lee Pitts for a big video auction company for over 20 years.

I suppose my friends figured that I might say something nice about their consignment and powerful bull battery if I was the one who bought the bulls to begin with. I bought truckloads of bulls for some of the biggest names in the business who I'm sure would not want their names associated with mine.

My friends and neighbors thought as long as I had to go to the sales anyway I might as well do something constructive and buy their bulls. There were other factors at work. Most of my friends are as tight as I am and they didn't want to spend the \$12.99 Motel Six was charging for a room 20 to 30 years ago.

There's also the fact that 10 percent of the general population are auction terrorphobics. Their hands get clammy, their eyes become glazed and their bidding arm and hand are suddenly paralyzed. This is how you end up with a rancher who bought a Longhorn at an all breed bull sale instead of the Charolais he came for. Or a bull with a 112 pound birth weight instead of the heifer bull that was desired.

In my bull buying days things were much easier and you didn't have all these abbreviations and numbers cluttering up the sale catalog and clouding the mind. Stuff like \$W, %F, \$G, \$B, RE, CW, CEM, MARB and HDK are turning ranchers, into computer geeks. Forty years ago we were lucky to get a weaning weight, a that worked. Heck, the all breeds bull sale at San Francisco's

Cow Palace didn't even demand a semen check on the sale bulls. In San Francisco I'm sure they thought it was discriminatory and sexist.

I thought it was asking a lot that one rancher I bought bulls for insisted I look at the bull's mother and sisters before I spent

the \$850 he gave me to buy each bull. The strangest request I had was from a guy who was at the sale. It was his theory that he was such an astute rancher that people would watch him and try to buy the same bulls he did, thus costing him more. So we worked out an arrangement where he'd remove his hat when he wanted me to buy the bull in the ring. He'd bought five bulls in a row before he remembered to put his hat

I can only remember a couple times when I really messed up. Once I bought two really good and expensive bulls for one friend and two really cheap ones for another guy and I had them shipped to an auction market equidistant to both their ranches. The problem arose when the cheap bull buyer got there first and took the two expensive bulls. Oh well, at least one guy was happy.

Then there was the time I was unceremoniously run out of Montana. It seems in that wonderful state, overflowing with great cattle, there is an unwritten rule that auctioneers will only take \$250 bids or greater and I kept trying to advance the bid by increments of \$12.50.

The most purebred cattle I ever bought at one sale was 42 head and I agonized over every one. I always tried to arrange cheap trucking and I only exceeded my limit once and that was by \$50. I also never charged anyone a dime for buying bulls. As a result, letters, and many ranchers showed their appreciation at Christmas. Over the years I was given boxes of rice, Pendleton blankets, crates of apples, styrofoam containers of great steaks, peaches, cans of almonds and olives, and a beautiful Mark Dahl-made silver belt buckle.

One smart aleck, the guy I bought a black Limousin bull for instead of the red one he requested, even sent me a brand new pair eyeglasses.

## John Lumpe new CEO Illinois Soybean Association

BLOOMINGTON, Ill. — As past executive director of the Ohio Soybean Association, Ohio Soybean Council and Ohio Soybean Council Foundation, John Lumpe knows a thing or two about the economics of soybeans. On Feb. 4, Lumpe, who most recently served as senior vice president of FLM Harvest, began his new career as CEO of the Illinois Soybean Association (ISA).

Taking time out to talk while moving his family from Columbus, Ohio to Bloomington, Ill., Lumpe told Farm

World he was looking forward to advancing ISA's commitment to achieving maximum profitability and global competitive positioning of Illinois soy for its farmer-members.

"I've been in agriculture in some way, shape or form my whole career, with most of it focused on the soybean," said Lumpe,

who has been married to his wife, an adoptions consultant, for nearly 27 years. The couple have two grown kids, Jack, 23 who will graduate

a degree in communications entrepreneurship, and Henry, a freshman in college also majoring in communications.

One of Lumpe's biggest responsibilities - and one he's had past experience with — will be administering the programs funded by the soybean checkoff program.

"I'm really looking forward to getting back to dealing

directly with the farmers. I've always enjoyed working directly for them and with them, and I think the soybean checkoff here in Illinois and in the U.S. provides great opportunities for farmers now and looking ahead. I want to help the 42,000 soybean

from college this year with farmers in Illinois benefit from the (ISA) and the checkoff program," the new ISA CEO said.

Implementation of Lumpe's and the ISA's short and long term priorities and goals begins with a "100-day plan" to usher in his tenure at Illinois Soy.

from which to move forward from."

Expanding market opportunities for Illinois soy and continuing to fund ILSoyAdvisor, an online, regional resource that provides growers with a wealth of tools and resources designed to increase their profitability, will remain top priorities of the ISA in 2020. Lumpe's shortterm personal priorities include attending as many summits, trade shows and seminars geared towards farmers as his schedule will permit.

"Ultimately I work for (farmers), but I want to work with them. I want to hear what they have to say in terms of ideas for the organization. I love the grassroots level and I want to get back to the base," said Lumpe, who describes himself as a major proponent for advocacy. "I will advocate at the state and national level for the ISA, the Illinois Sovbean Growers and the American Sovbean Association. It's very important, and I've always said, that the associations work hand in hand at both the state and national levels, because they need each other. The advocacy component is critical."

The ISA board of directors selected Lumpe to replace former CEO Craig Ratajczyk, who left the association last August, and interim CEO Mark

Johnson agrees that more creative thinking is needed. Many farmers are applying maintenance phosphorus, just as much as the crop will use. Yet studies show that even then, soil test levels don't vary much from year to year.

"Some farms haven't applied phosphorus in 5 to 10 years, yet there is just a tiny decrease in soil test levels," she said. "Why would dissolved phosphorus have gone down so much (last year)? I don't think it is because suddenly the pool

of phosphorus in the soil is depleted." Instead, Johnson thinks it is a placement issue. The evidence here and from other places has shown that with conservation tillage, paired with broadcast applications of fertilizer, researchers see reductions in DRP. Subsurface fertilizer injection, or getting the nutrient deeper into the soil in the row where the crop needs it, may be the way going forward.

LaBarge and Johnson will be talking more about this topic at the March 3-4 Conservation Tillage and Technology Conference at the McIntosh Center. They are among 65 presenters. For information visit fabe.osu.edu/CTCon.

## 8th Annual Indiana Small Farm Conference preview

DANVILLE, Ind. — For the first time, the Indiana Small Farm Conference will offer presentations designed to generate an interest in farming among young people, a conference organizer said.

The eighth annual event is March 5-7 at the Hendricks County 4-H Fairgrounds and Conference Complex. Pre-conference registration ends Feb. 27.

Topics geared toward youth include exploring careers with insect biology, plant or animal sciences, square foot gardening, raising honey bees and using 4-H or FFA experiences to create a career.

"The conference committee decided if we wanted to reach out to the next generation of potential farmers, we needed to figure out how to include them," explained Tamara Benjamin, committee chair and Purdue University assistant program leader in agriculture and natural resources. "We're trying to create an atmosphere where they'll be welcome. We talk about how our farmers are aging out. We're not going a good job of bringing in the next generation."

The conference also features a variety of topics for all small-scale farmers, whether new or experienced. Speakers will discuss vegetable production, animal behavior, urban agriculture, cover crops, social media, regulations and learning to facilitate civil dialogues around racial issues and their intersection with the food system. Jean-Martin Fortier, The Market Gardener, is a keynote speaker, as is Darby Simpson, of Simpson Family Farm, Martinsville, Ind. A trade show is included.

"I hope attendees walk out of the conference energized, having met new people," Benjamin said. "I hope they walk out knowing where they can get information – from extension, farmers and others. I want them to know they're not alone. I hope they know they have a community now."

About 400-450 people are expected to attend this year, she said.

Dr. Cheryl Miller, district 5 field veterinarian with the Indiana State Board of Animal Health (BOAH), will discuss ways to protect livestock from disease.

"I want to stress the importance of biosecurity whether it's a producer with just a few animals or hundreds of animals," noted Miller, also BOAH's director of the scrapie and tuberculosis programs. "Biosecurity may not be as front and center for smaller-scale producers as for larger producers. Smaller-scale producers may not stop and think biosecurity measures apply to them too. I want to make them aware."

Sara Bagby Farmer and Kristi Schultz, both Master of social work graduate students in Indiana University's School of Social Work, will offer tips to farmers possibly dealing with mental health issues.

"There are less mental health providers in rural communities," Schultz said. "There are barriers to access. Farmers in rural areas might feel isolated and have a sense of helplessness about things they can't control. We'll talk about ways to challenge negative thoughts or negative behavior patterns."

Smaller-scale producers may face different stresses than those running larger scale operations, Farmer said. Small farm operators are working to carry out their own model of what a farm looks like to them, she said.

The cost to attend the conference is \$90 (one day), \$162 (two days) and \$228 (three days) for adults, and \$30 (one day), \$48 (two days) and \$60 (three days) for those 18 and under. Registrations will be accepted the day of the event but meals won't be included. The Indiana Farmers Union is offering one-day registrations for youth. As of press time, some remained. ## opens investigation GAO into MFP farm payments

WASHINGTON, D.C. The Government Accountability Office non-partisan Congress's auditing agency, is opening an investigation into the \$28 billion farmer payment program. The review comes at the request of Michigan Democrat Senator Debbie Stabenow, who states that the program is biased toward southern states that voted for President Trump in the 2016 election and favors large and foreign agriculture companies over small farms.

The Market Facilitation Program (MFP) was announced in August of 2018 as an income supplement to help offset the losses caused by the trade war with China as well as lost sales from the European Union, Canada and Mexico. The trade war was a primary factor in spiking farm bankruptcies and led to a USDA pledge for \$12 billion in aid in 2018 and an additional \$14.5 billion in 2019. The program

grew to \$28 million last year as the trade dispute with China escalated. Now Stabenow is raising concerns that the aid distribution is not coming so much from those who need it, than by political consideration. The formula for the MFP used a Depression-era fund which allowed farmers that earned less than \$900,000 per year to receive money if they produced one of the agricultural products which faced retaliation.

"It's clear that the Trump Administration's trade assistance payments pick winners and losers rather than help the farmers who have been hit the hardest by this president's trade policies," said Stabenow, the top Democrat on the Senate Agriculture Committee. "This investigation will shed more light on what has been happening, and bring accountability and fairness to a program that has spent billions of taxpayer dollars."

For the 2019 fiscal year, which ended in September of that year, 580 Chapter 12 farm or fishery bankruptcies were filed, a 24 percent increase from 2018. It was the most bankruptcy filings of that kind since 2011, when 676 Chapter 12 bankruptcies were filed. Wisconsin led the way with 48 filings. Georgia, Nebraska and Kansas tied for second with 37 each.

A 2019 report by the American Farm Bureau Federation found that farm income reached \$88 billion for the year; however, 40 percent of that -- \$33 billion -- came from trade aid, disaster assistance, the farm bill or insurance indemnities.

Some critics of the aid package point to a National Foundation for American Policy analysis which concluded the spending on farmers was higher than the annual budgets of several government agencies. "The amount of money raises questions about the strategy of imposing tariffs and permitting the use of taxpayer money to shield policymakers from the consequences of their actions," according to the analysis. Those who opposed the payment money point to the fact that \$28 billion approved by the Trump administration exceeded budgetary funds for the Department of State (\$26.3 billion), Nuclear Forces (\$21.8 billion) and NASA (\$19.8

Previously, a bi-partisan group of Congressmen -- led by Senator Marco Rubio (R-Fl) and Senator Bob Menendez (D-NJ) -- also expressed concerns that JBS, a Brazilianowned meat-processor whose majority shareholders, brothers Wesley Batista and Joesley Batista, pleaded guilty to corruption charges in Brazil, should not have received the \$67 million in bailout funds which they were given.

The Trump administration, which signed an initial trade deal with China in January, said the farm subsidies would end this year.

**Lunar Phase And Lore** 

The Lambing and Kidding Moon, becoming the new Broody Hen Moon at 4:04 p.m. on February 23, reaches apogee, its position farthest from Earth at 6:36 a.m. on February 26. On March 1, the moon enters its second quarter at 8:42 p.m. The Broody Hen Moon is often a Late Winter moon, bringing on BHS (Broody Hen Syndrome)! It's a time to check your chickens closely, remove eggs promptly - or let the hen hatch her brood, if that fits your plans.

Rising in the middle of the day and setting in the middle of the night, this moon passes overhead after sundown, encouraging fish to feed from late in the day into the dark, especially as the last cold front of February and the first front of March approach.

#### **Weather Trends**

Throughout March, average temperatures climb almost a dozen degrees, the world warming twice as fast as it did in February. Starting in the lower 30s on the first of the month, normal averages rise one degree every 50 hours, reaching the middle 40s by the beginning of April. Typical lows swell from the 20s to well above freezing, and highs climb from the lower 40s up to near 55.

A typical March temperature distribution for the Lower Midwest includes up to two days in the 70s, five days in the 60s, six days in the 50s, nine days in the 40s, eight days in the 30s, and one day in the 20s. Frost occurs on about a dozen of the 31 mornings in March. Once in a great while, the land is frost-free after equinox, and the last hard freeze of the season frequently takes place prior to the first of April.

This year, another Supermoon is likely to bring a bitter storm to the second week of the month. Full moon on March 9 and lunar perigee (when the moon is closest to Earth) on the 10th will combine to put snowdrops and crocus under snow and ice.

## **Countdown to Spring**

One week to owl hatching time and woodcock mating time

Two weeks to the beginning of the morning robin chorus before sunrise.

Three weeks to daffodil season and silver maple blooming season and the first golden goldfinches.

Four weeks to tulip season and the first wave of blooming woodland wildflowers and the first butterflies

Five weeks until golden forsythia blooms and skunk cabbage sends out its first leaves and the lawn is long enough to cut

Six weeks until American toads sing their mating songs in the dark and corn planting time begins

Seven weeks until the peak of Middle Spring wildflowers in the wood and the full bloom of flowering fruit trees

Eight weeks until the first rhubarb

Nine weeks until the first cricket song on Late Spring

Ten weeks to the great warbler migration through the Lower Midwest In the Field and Garden

Plant seeds (indoors) for flowers and vegetables that produce their fruit above ground before full moon

As the moon wanes through the second week of March, continue seeding in flats (or directly in the ground) vegetables that will produce their fruit below ground.

Install cross fences to facilitate crop rotation.

Remove old rhubarb and asparagus stalks, cleaning out around the beds, digging in well rotted manure.

Graft and repot house plants. Dig fence post holes when the ground is soft and wet.

Try a first row of radishes, leeks, peas. Put in spring wheat when conditions permit.

## Tough lessons for farm kids

TRUTH IN THE TRENCHES

Eavesdropping on a recent conversation between daughter and acquaintance, I heard her say, "I was 14 years old when my parents left the farm for a few days and my brothers and I were responsible for all of it."

That one sentence washed over me and I realized how much responsibility was hoisted on four kids ages 12, 14, 16 and 18. They had

no physical limitations, they were all strong and healthy enough to handle the rigors of keeping a dairy farm running on a daily basis, but there was also the mental toughness and resiliency required when the skidsteer wouldn't start, the compressor malfunctioned or a cow was calving.

Five days ago, I was speaking to a group of people and there were several retired farmers in the room. We reminisced about life on the farm and the workload, and how much they benefited from being expected to support the family farm. Riding home from that event, I couldn't help but think of the youth today who will never have that same benefit of working in a family business. But I also wondered how much guilt might be felt by those parents who not only expect but need their kids to pitch in on the family farm.

While other kids are walking in after basketball practice to eat and relax on the couch while snapchatting with their friends, farm kids are changing their clothes and heading out to the

barn to help finish up chores. On a Saturday morning when most kids are catching up on their sleep, farm kids are expected to haul manure, cut wood or clean calf hutches. The entire family will often never be seen at a wedding, on vacation or

at a holiday party because someone has to stay home and make sure all the chores are done.

It is easy to feel sorry for the kid with a daily

workload at 10 or 12 years old when his contemporaries often won't see a paycheck until they hit 18 or 20. But don't let your sympathy blind you from what you are contributing to the future workforce.

By expecting youth to step up and help with age appropriate chores, you are providing a valuable employee who will show up and do a job for a future employer. By having your kids contribute, you are enforcing a work ethic not only for our work force but for a future family and community. When you meet your kids in the barn at 5:30 am on a school day, you are simply teaching them to show up for the rest of their lives.

Character is not built on a couch and resiliency is not taught on a wireless device. But both are needed to make it in a world where an increasing population wants ease without work ethic and will settle for a complacent cup of mediocrity.


Keep your expectations for your kids high and let them get dirty; they will succeed in any direction they go.



HighGround Dairy (HGD) says "This will include dairy products that had tariffs imposed by China over the past two years." Nonfat dry

milk powder was on China's short dairy list, says HGD, and "This opens up opportunities for US products and conveys how desperate China has become to procure foreign goods. Tariff exemptions will make the procurement of US goods more attractive in an attempt to meet their commitment to purchase \$200 billion of additional goods and services over the next two years. If and when the Chinese are ready to purchase dairy products from the US, this is bullish to whole milk, skim milk, and sweet whey powder sourced from the States."

Matt Gould, analyst and editor of the Dairy and Food Market Analyst newsletter, said in the Feb. 24 Dairy Radio Now broadcast that the tariffs being removed were 25 percent so on March 2, when this goes into effect, the end cost to Chinese customers is a drop of about 25 cents per pound "which in the commodity world is huge." He also credited the first phase agreement President Trump negotiated with China for this concession and said, "hopefully this is part of a de-escalation of the trade war overall."

Cooperatives Working Together (CWT) member cooperatives accepted 18 offers of export assistance this week from CWT to help capture sales of 1.166 million pounds of Cheddar cheese, 79,366 pounds of butter, 112,436 pounds of cream cheese, and 1.323 million pounds of whole milk powder.

January US milk output hit 18.8 billion pounds, according to preliminary data in the Agriculture Department's first Milk Production report of 2020. That's up 0.9percent from January 2019. Output in the top 24 states totaled 17.9 billion, up 1.2 percent. Revisions added 88 million pounds to the original 50-state December total, now put at 18.37 billion pounds, up 1.2percent from Dec. 2018.

The report pegged 2019 milk output at 218 billion pounds, up 0.4percent from 2018, the slowest growth rate since 2009. Cow numbers totaled 9.34 million head, down 0.7 percent from 2018 and up 2.3 percent from 2010. The 2019 output per cow averaged 23,391 pounds, up 241 pounds. The average annual rate of milk per cow has increased 10.6 percent from 2010, according to the USDA.

Meanwhile, on farm dairy margins, "weakened slightly since the end of January but remain historically strong with projected profitability at

China, still reeling from African or just below the 90th percentile of

the previous decade throughout 2020," according to the latest Margin Watch (MW) from Chicago-based Commodity & Ingredient Hedging LLC.

The MW stated, "While the milk market sold off, this was offset by corresponding weakness in feed input costs to mitigate the impact on margins. Milk prices have been under pressure due to concerns over the spreading coronavirus in China and its

potential impact on forward demand. The latest GDT saw whole milk powder (WMP) fall to a six-month low of \$3,039 per MT, down 6.2 percent from the previous event due to concerns of slumping Chinese consumption."

The MW cited December's high level of nonfat dry milk and skim milk powder production detailed in the latest Dairy Products report as well as the large stockpiles, which I detailed previously. The MW says "December trade data also indicated that high US cheese prices weighed on overseas demand, with exports of 57.6 million pounds during the month, down 9.3 percent from 2018 and below the fiveyear average of 60.3 million pounds for the month. This slowdown in export demand may continue through firth November, down a whopping 9.4 percent quarter as high prices are likely to encourage buyers to procure cheaper EU supplies," the MW warned.

"USDA updated their balance sheet estimates in the February World Agricultural Supply and Demand Estimates report with decreased price projections for both cheese and butter due to weak demand. Projected cheese prices were lowered to \$1.79 per pound from \$1.8350 in January, and butter prices declined to \$1.91 per pound from \$1.96 last month," the MW concluded.

In perhaps a knee jerk reaction to China's announcement Monday, Grade A nonfat dry milk jumped 3 cents Tuesday, to \$1.20, but closed Friday at \$1.17, unchanged on the week but 17.25 cents above a year ago, with 28

FC Stone points out in its Feb. 20 Early Morning Update that, since December 2017, the price of nonfat dry milk has doubled in the US. In Dec. 2017, it hit a low of 64.75 cents per pound. Late last month it hit \$1.2975.

CME dry whey held all week at 37 cents per pound, 2.25 cents above a year ago, with no sales reported on the week.

US fluid milk sales continue to falter.

from Nov. 2018. Conventional product sales totaled 3.5 billion pounds, down 10 percent from a year ago. Organic products, at 220 million pounds, were up 1.0percent but represented just 5.9percent of total sales for the month. Whole milk totaled 1.2 billion pounds, down 8.3percent from a year ago and made up 32 percent of total fluid sales in the month. Sales for the 11 month period totaled 13.7 billion pounds, up 0.1 percent from a year ago. Skim milk sales, at 258 million pounds, were down 16.4 percent and made up 6.9 percent of total milk sales for the month.

Total packaged fluid milk sales, January through November, totaled 41.95 billion pounds, down 2.5 percent from a year ago. Conventional products year-to-date totaled 39.6 billion pounds, down 2.5 percent. Organic products, at 2.3 billion pounds, were down 2.0percent and represented 5.5 percent of total fluid milk sales for the period.

Speaking of falling fluid sales, the March Federal order Class I base milk price was announced at \$17.46 per hundredweight, down 9 cents from February but \$1.48 above March 2019 and the highest March Class I price in six years. It equates to about \$1.50 per gallon, up from \$1.37 a year ago.
