

Fertilizer prices continue to climb; especially phosphate

BLOOMINGTON, Ill. – With corn and soybean prices expected to continue to languish at below-break-even levels into 2026, many producers are left wondering if and when fertilizer prices will respond accordingly. Far from receding, average fertilizer prices across the board were higher the week ending Nov. 13 except for liquid nitrogen, which held steady.

"This all comes down to actual supply and demand," said Kevin "KJ" Johnson, president of the Illinois Fertilizer and Chemical Association (IFCA), responding to the Illinois Department of Agriculture's Nov. 14 Fuel and Fertilizer Production Cost Report. The bi-weekly report showed that an-

hydrous ammonia sold for between \$780 to \$925 per ton, for an average price to farmers of \$838.82. That's an increase of \$8.55 per ton over the previous report, which was issued Oct.

DAP, at \$785 to \$930 per ton, averaged \$884.56 at retail, up \$5 per ton. Liquid nitrogen at 28 percent sold for \$415 to \$464, an average of \$440.60 and \$2 per ton higher than the previous report. Liquid N at 32 percent, at \$475 per ton, was the only form of fertilizer to hold steady in price.

In addition, MAP, at \$725 to \$1,020 per ton, averaged \$876 per ton, which was up \$36.67 per ton. At \$457 to \$530 per ton, potash sold for an average of \$501 per ton, up \$7.08. Urea, at \$575 to \$625 average per ton price, sold for \$612, up \$5 per ton.

"The biggest thing, if there is sticker shock on anything, it is on phosphate prices," Johnson said. "This is the one that jumps out at most people. One of the reasons you are seeing that is because of China. Back during COVID or just before, China supplied around one-third of the world's phosphates. China is not exporting any phosphates."

While the U.S. did not purchase vast amounts of phosphates from China, Brazil and other major crop-producing nations depended on Chinese fertilizers for their crops. But when one-third of the world's supply of a product is taken off the market, prices will react correspondingly across the board, Johnson explained.

"We hope in this industry that China does start opening (phosphate exports) back up. Everyone is seeing at the retail level that (prices) for early buy-ins of phosphates for August 2026 are already starting to go up," he said. "There is already talk within the industry that there is going to be pullback on the grower level."

This is because farmers are already tightening their belts when it comes to fertilizer purchases, according to the IFCA leader. Word from many of the retailers comprising IFCA's membership reaching Johnson is that up to 20 percent fewer sales were booked for 2025 fertilizers compared to the prior year.

"It won't happen today with prices, but if (farmers) are still pulling back in the spring, that could drive prices. My worry is that in corn and soybean land, economics are not great. But what is

Michigan, Tennessee FFA members part of new national officer team

INDIANAPOLIS – When Lilly Nyland heard her name announced as a member of the 2025-26 National FFA officer team, she said she realized all her hard work had paid off. T. Wayne Williams said he thought of all the people who had helped him achieve his goal.

Nyland (secretary) and Williams (southern region vice president) were elected Nov. 1 during the 98th annual FFA convention in Indianapolis. Nyland is a former member of Careerline Tech Center FFA in Michigan, and Williams is a former member of Woodbury FFA in Tennessee.

"Words can't describe the surreal feeling I had in the moment when I was called on stage as a national officer," Nyland recalled. "It was so sweet to hear Michigan called first. You can see in the video that my mouth was wide open the whole time I ran up.

"I thought of the personal growth, how this process has changed my life, the countless hours of prep, and the inspiration others have had on my life. As I looked out into Lucas Oil (Stadium) and saw the members I get to serve, the excitement for this year was overwhelming and something I don't think I'll ever be able to shake."

Nyland said she was inspired to run for national office by a chapter alumna, a classmate and two state officers. She said those people – and others – had been lights in her life, and she wanted to have that same impact for others. FFA and the agriculture, food and natural resources industries offer the perfect environment for students to discover who they truly are, Nyland noted, adding she's grateful for how those spaces and the people within them have given her this opportunity for self-discovery.

Williams said when his name was called, the first thing he felt was com-

plete shock.

"As I was running up on stage, I kept thinking about all the people who helped me get there, my FFA adviser who talked me through moments of fear and stress, my parents who supported every crazy dream I chased in this blue jacket, and the mentors who met with me every week since May, pushing and encouraging me to grow," he said.

"All of their faces just started flashing through my mind, and I couldn't wait to see them afterward. It was one of those moments where you realize this accomplishment isn't yours alone – it belongs to everyone who believed in you along the way."

A worse-than-hoped for showing at the Tennessee Trapshooting Championship in 2021, and supportive words from his grandfather afterward, helped to guide Williams' decision to run for national office. That moment, he explained, taught him to stop fearing failure and to focus on what really matters: character, courage and support. Williams said FFA has given him that same kind of foundation – a place to grow, lead and serve.

Nyland and Williams have goals for their time as national officers.

"This is a year of total service," Nyland pointed out. "Service is the act of valuing others over myself, and that is my commitment this year. Something I'm excited for is all the travel and getting to experience different areas and cultures of our beautiful country and world. As a national officer, we get to chat with people from all of these places. First, I'm excited to hear their stories and learn from them. Secondly, hearing their point of view and bringing that to the National FFA office and board of directors."

Williams said it's truly a privilege and blessing to be a national officer.

"I want to learn from FFA members across the country, to hear their stories,

He's studying agricultural communications at Tennessee Tech University, and eventually hopes to attend law school to study agricultural law and policy. Nyland is a former Michigan FFA state secretary, and is taking a gap year while serving as a state officer and national officer candidate. She plans to pursue a career in agricultural communications.

"It is also my mission to highlight our members to stakeholders and show them our members' unique strengths, because our industry needs each student," she said.



Non-toxic lubricant developed for farming equipment

RALEIGH, N.C. - Researchers at North Carolina State University have developed a new, non-toxic solid lubricant for farm equipment used for seed dispersal.

Typically, solid lubricants are used to prevent seeds from sticking together or clumping, which can jam machinery used to plant seeds. However, commercially available lubricants contain ingredients that can be toxic to farmers, farmland and pollinators, including talc and microplastics, said Martin Thuo, professor of materials science and engineering at NC State, said.

Canada banned the use of talc and graphite as seed lubricants for pneumatic planters when planting corn and soybean seed treated with neonicotinoid insecticides because talc and graphite tend to erode the treated seed coating. This means that the dust generated during planting can carry the insecticide off the seed into the air, which could potentially be inhaled or ingested by pollinators and cause their deaths.

While other countries have not formally banned talc as a seed lubricant, there have been movements to ban its use in other industries. For example, talc is anticipated to be banned in 2027 across the European Union after the European Chemicals Agency's Committee for Risk Assessment classified talc as carcinogenic, mutagenic and reprotoxic. This ban will apply to cosmetics and other products available for consumer consumption.

Talc has been under scrutiny in the U.S. since the Johnson & Johnson lawsuits, which have focused on the

baby powders. However, there have been no specific bans related to talc's use in food, pharmaceutical or cosmetic products.

Some companies, like Bayer Crop-Science, have begun to offer alternatives to talc and graphite seed lubricants. However, these alternatives often use plastics, leading to concerns about microplastics, or the tiny plastic particles that persist after the breakdown of larger plastic items. Microplastics are a growing concern among scientists in all fields and are problematic for human and animal health, as well as having detrimental impacts on the environment.

"It is unfortunate that current products are threatening our food supply. While Canada and (the) EU are taking steps to protect farmers, it is my hope that the U.S. and other large mechanized (agriculture) economies like Brazil and Australia will ban these materials before it's too late," Thuo said.

Thuo and his research group set out to make a safer seed lubricant alternative. First, the research group explored talc-like compounds, but found that while these compounds made good lubricants, they were expensive for farmers. The group then began exploring cellulose, an abundant compound most known for being the structural component of the cell walls of green plants. The team was able to create a lubricant derived from cellulose, made up of millions of tiny fibers. The surface is grafted with hydrophobic particles that repel water.

"Scientifically, we would call (the lubricant) a network disruptor. It (interferes) with how forces move with-

risk of asbestos present in talc-based in a bed of particles to avoid convergence (jamming or clustering)," Thuo explained. "By disrupting the nature of seed-to-seed contact, being able to absorb moisture, and the ability to remove any surface charges, allows these materials to disrupt force distribution in a collection of seeds as they move down the planter."

In other words, the lubricant works because it reduces the friction that happens when seeds rub against each other, because the cellulose fibers are smoother than the surface of the seeds. The fibers are even more slippery because the hydrophobic particles on the cellulose fibers repel the absorbed water on the surface of the seeds.

Thuo and his research team tested

the material over hundreds of acres across several years through blind testing with farmers.

"We found that we get very high efficiency in planting, and the yield of the crops is comparable to that of talc or microplastic fluency agents," Thuo

Additionally, the group found that very little of the seed coating is eroded when using the cellulose-based lubricant. This means that the dust produced during planting is less likely to contain pesticides that can be harmful to pollinators, birds and farmers.

"We are working with some of the leading ag companies to see how to best get this to market," Thuo added.

Compared to last Monday the feeder market was stronger in spots with a average quality offering. er steers 600 lbs and under were steady to 5.00 higher with a good supply and good demand, while the yearling steers appeared stronger but with limited comparisons. Feeder heifers were unevenly steady bouncing from 3.00 lower to 3.00 higher across the weight classes with a good supply and spotty demand. Buyers were active today and willing pay premiums for weaned packages and harder conditioned calves, while discounts off colored and heavy conditioned calves severely. Slaughter cows were 2.00 to 4.00 higher with a good supply and slaughter bulls were steady to 2.00 lower with good demand. Supply included: 90% Feeder Cattle (37% Steers, 43% Heifers, 20% Bulls); 10% Slaughter Cattle (2% Heifers, 87% Cows, 11% Bu Groups of 20 Head or More.

Indiana poultry producers meet to donate product to food pantries

The event recognized the efforts of Indiana's poultry and egg companies to ensure those experiencing food insecurity have access to poultry and eggs at food pantries across the state. It also highlighted the work those companies do to support char-

itable organizations in their communities.

Poultry and eggs are always in demand at food pantries. Over the past year, \$620,000 worth of chicken, duck and turkey have been donated to Indiana food banks and community organizations by Indiana poultry producers to help Hoosiers in need. Indiana egg producers have also provided 833,000 dozen eggs to their Hoosier neighbors, with an additional 1 million dozen being distributed across the nation.

Beyond giving of their poultry products, poultry companies provided in excess of \$650,000 in direct contributions to various non-forprofit and charitable organizations.

"Indiana's poultry and egg farmers are a vital part of our state's economic strength," said Gov. Mike Braun. "Their leadership in supporting communities and stepping up for their neighbors make a real difference across Indiana, and I'm proud to recognize their continued generosity and commitment."

The ceremony also included reflections on the size of Indiana's poultry sector. Indiana is one of the top poultry-producing states in the country. According to the USDA National Agriculture Statistics Service,

Indiana ranks first in duck production; third in egg production; fourth in turkey production; and notes its broiler chicken production as well. Indiana's size across multiple poultry sectors is unique in the country. Further, it contributes over \$18 billion in total economic activity, and it directly employs more than 12,700 Hoosiers.

ISPA President Rebecca Eifert Joniskan shared, "Poultry farming in Indiana is a family affair. The companies represented here today all started as small, family-owned operations, committed to producing quality products. They know families cannot thrive without healthy food, and they are humbled to be able to make a difference in the lives of other Hoosier families."

The poultry and egg products on display at the event were donated to Second Helpings, a hunger relief agency in Indianapolis. The ceremony marks an annual tradition that dates back to the late 1940s.



in worse shape is cotton, which is truly underwater. What you could see is acres taken out of cotton and put into corn and soybeans that are still using those fertilizers," Johnson said.

"You'll need to see a pullback for at least a few months on demand to pull the price down on anything. I think it is starting to go in that direction, but if we are going to have 98 million acres of corn again there is going to be the same demand (for fertilizers)."

Specifically, IFCA-led research shows that farmers had been steady over the past three years in potash and nitrogen purchases at retail before tapering off in fall 2025. Sales figures also suggest that growers are likely not embracing other types of fertilizers in their stead.

"I think they are more rolling the dice that it's going to be cheaper in the spring, or they've built up their P program over the years so they can pull back this year. I'm not hearing a bunch of guys saying they are not going to put any phosphates on in the spring, but I'm hearing that rates are coming down," Johnson said.





November WASDE data neutral

Very few changes were made to corn balance sheets in the long-awaited November WAS-DE report. The U.S. corn yield was trimmed to 186 bushels per acre, down 0.7 bu from September. This was above the average trade estimate, as was the crop size of 16.752 billion bu. Both are record sized. The only change to demand MARKET ANALYSIS was a 100 million bu in-By Karl Setzer crease in exports. Even with

a lower yield, this was enough to raise projected ending stocks by 44 mbu to a total of 2.154 bbu. This is a 13.3 percent stocks to use and equates to a \$4.00 average cash value, which is up 10 cents from September.

For soybeans, the USDA trimmed the average U.S. yield by 0.6 bushel, putting it at an even 53 bu per acre. This lowered the U.S. crop size by 48 mbu to a 4.25 bbu total. Another 13 mbu of soybeans were removed from the U.S. supply as old crop carryin was reduced as well. This lower supply was partially offset by a 1 mbu reduction to residual demand an a 50 mbu cut to projected exports. The lower supply was still enough to lower the U.S. carryout by 10 mbu, taking it to 290 mbu, 14 mbu below the average trade guess. This took the stocks to use on sovbeans to 6.7 percent, a level that indicates a \$10.50 average cash value. This was a 50-cent increase from September.

Even fewer alterations were made to U.S. wheat balance sheets this month. The average U.S. wheat yield was bumped up 0.6 bushel to 53.3 bushels per acre. The USDA trimmed harvested wheat acres by 100,000, but added in 700,000 to the planted side. This added 58 mbu of wheat to the U.S.

production figure, putting it at 901 mbu, well above the average trade estimate. This is a 43.9 percent stocks to use and equates to an average \$5 bushel value. This was a 10-cent reduction from the September estimate.

> A few more changes were made to the global side of the report than the domestic side. The world corn carryout is now estimated at 281.34 million metric tons, 1.5 mmt


under the average estimate, and just beneath the September figure of 281.4 mmt. This is 10 mmt less corn than last year, and 34 mmt less than the year before that. World soybean carryover is projected at 121.99 mmt, below both the average estimate for 124.2 mmt and the September number of 123.99 mmt. The world wheat ending stocks are now projected at 271.43 mmt. This was well above the average trade guess for 266.1 mmt and September's 264.06 mmt estimate.

The U.S. beef and pork balance sheets were also little changed this month. Beef production for this year was trimmed 70 million pounds to total 25.76 billion pounds. For 2026, beef production was estimated at 25.39 billion pounds, down 100 million pounds from September's estimate. Beef exports for 2025 were lowered by 100 million pounds to a 2.63-billion-pound total. For next year, U.S. beef exports are estimated at 2.53 billion pounds, unchanged from September.

Beef imports for both 2025 and 2026 were unchanged this month at 5.36 billion pounds and 4.95 billion pounds, respectively.

Pork production for 2025 was

"My mom's involvement certainly didn't hurt my connection with the folks there as far as knowing what was going on."

Licking County was a natural fit. "When we came to Ohio, we actually lived in Perry County. I started my grad work, and at the same time, my husband began work with extension as a natural resources educator," McCutcheon said. "So, I was very familiar with Licking County due to its proximity to where we were living.'

is a multifaceted effort. "We do a little bit of everything," McCutcheon said. Word-of-mouth from current advisers and families, community events, social media, and support from the Licking County 4-H Committee all play a

role. "We also recently added a mascot - Carrie the Clover - who makes appearances at community events and helps remind families that 4-H is fun and relevant," she said. "For youth to choose 4-H, they need to see it as both fun and meaningful.'

Prize-winning show bull opens door to the future

FRANKFORT, Ind. – A prize-winning show bull from his tiny herd in Indiana turned out to be his ticket from working in a feed mill to his calling in life as a cattleman.

Brody Fitzgerald, 28, of Frankfort, said he saw major potential in his now 2-year-old bull after he was born in September 2023.

Fitzgerald said giving birth to the animal was the daughter of a pair of male and female bulls he and his grandfather, Earl Clock, purchased together to start their own herd.

The herd was kept at his grandfather's small corn and soybean farm in Fairmount.

A few more bulls were added to the herd before Clock passed away just before the birth of the bull Fitzgerald named "St. Elmo" after a historic steakhouse in Indianapolis.

Fitzgerald, who showed bulls as a youth in 4-H and member of the National Junior Angus Association, said he saw great potential in his calf because his body seemed structurally perfect and his feet lined up correctly.


"He looked the part," he said.

Fitzgerald said he tried putting everything he had into making a champion out of the bull, who racked up a number of strong finishes, including first place titles, before being declared by the American Angus Association its 2024-25 "Show Bull of the Year."

His best finishes in show competitions, often against bulls from much larger herds, included grand champion and reserve grand champion at events in Kentucky, Tennessee, Pennsylvania and Missouri.

Points earned in each of the 16 show competitions held annually by the American Angus Association from June 1 to May 31 are used in naming the show bull of the year and other awards for animals, breeders and own-

The winners were announced Nov. 1 during the American Angus Associa-

tion awards dinner, which was part of its annual convention in Kansas City,

Early in his successful run, people in the industry who were taking notice led Fitzgerald to a job managing a cattle breeding operation near Frankfort last year. Now, Fitzgerald is leaving soon to manage a smaller herd at a well-established show cattle operation focusing heavily on genetics near Plymouth.

"The end goal was landing a job in the cattle industry by using the bull to meet people to connect me to potential job opportunities. That's exactly what this bull did for me," he said.

Fitzgerald didn't grow up on a ranch but was around the industry from his father managing cattle operations in other states like Pennsylvania where he spent most of his time as a child.

He was in his third year as an agribusiness student at Oklahoma State University when he decided to drop out and move to Indiana just down the road from his grandfather.

Fitzgerald, who wasn't sure what he wanted to do for a living yet, was working at a nearby feed mill when his grandfather, who once raised a few Angus cattle, suggested they form a herd

His prize-winning bull has retired from competing but has become a source for semen Fitzgerald is making available to breeders for purchase.

He has no other plans for his prize-winning cow except to let him live out the rest of his life with his oth-

"There's nothing too strenuous coming in his days to come," he said.

Fitzgerald, who recalled his days playing cowboy and being around cows as a child, said it's a great feeling to finally discover what he firmly believes is his true calling.

"It's what I want to do for the rest of my life. To me, it doesn't feel like work even though it can be rigorous at times," he said.

China reportedly purchased nearly million metric tons of US soybeans

URBANA, Ill. - Independent news sources and traders reported on Nov. 17 that China had purchased nearly 1 million metric tons of U.S. soybeans. If confirmed, it would be China's largest U.S. soybean purchase since at least January and the most significant since the Oct. 30 summit in Busan, South Korea, between President Donald Trump and President Xi Jinping.

"China is buying U.S. soybeans to meet the pledges it made to Washington...even though the cargoes are priced higher than rival Brazilian offers, two Asia-based traders said," Reuters News reported. "This bigger round of U.S. soybean buying is no longer a goodwill gesture but a manifestation of China's commitment to the Busan terms,' said a Singapore-based trader."

The Reuters report stated that "China's state-owned grain trader COFCO bought at least 840,000 metric tons for shipment in December and January, the two traders with knowledge of the deals told Reuters. Eight of the vessels were for shipment in December and January from U.S. Gulf Coast terminals, while the rest were for shipment in January from Pacific Northwest ports, one trader said. A second trader estimated around 75 percent of the sales were for Gulf shipment, with the remainder from the Pacific Northwest ports."

Bloomberg further reported that "the purchases have reignited market optimism around the sovbean trade between the two agricultural powerhouses, which was worth more than \$12 billion last year and will underpin any trade agreement."

Though China has yet to confirm the specific purchase commitments, it has moved to reduce tariffs on the crop and lifted import bans on three American exporters, including CHS Inc., reciprocating similar conciliatory actions from the U.S., according to the news service.

"We haven't even finished the agreement, which we hope to have done by Thanksgiving," Bessent said in an interview with Fox News' Sunday Morning Futures.

A recent article published by the Purdue University Center for Commercial Agriculture examines how the current proposed deal compares to previous U.S. export levels to China, and how it could impact the global soybean market in the years to come. The article, "U.S.-China Soybean Deal: Comparing Past Export Levels and Global Market Impacts" (Colussi, J. and M.

fulfills their reported 12-million-ton purchase commitment in the last two months of the year, U.S. soybean exports to the Chinese market in 2025 would total around 18 million metric tons - 33 percent lower than in 2024, when exports to China reached 26.8 million metric tons.

"The announcement that China would resume purchases from the United States supported soybean futures, which had moved slightly higher in recent days, reaching almost \$11 per bushel - the highest level in over a year. Still, after the \$11 per bushel futures price is adjusted for basis, the resulting cash price is still below the break-even point for many U.S. sovbean producers in 2025," Langemeier and Colussi stated.

Meanwhile, Brazil's strong export performance in 2025 means the competitive landscape has become more crowded, with Chinese buyers attracted to South America's lower transaction fees and tariffs. American shipments of U.S. soybeans to China still face a 13 percent retaliatory tariff, maintaining the competitiveness of South American soybeans in the global market.

"In recent months, Brazil and Argentina have reached record export volumes to China. Despite the recent reduction in Chinese tariffs on U.S agricultural products, South America is expected to maintain a strong position in the global soybean trade. Brazil's expanded planted area projected for the 2025/26 crop season and the

gentina further reinforce this competitive outlook," according to the Purdue report authors.

The deal came just three days after USDA released its first agricultural data in more than 43 days following the government shutdown, which created serious doubts about whether China would follow through on its Busan promise.

"The USDA report released after the government reopened showed only two Chinese purchases of American soybeans since the summit in South Korea that totaled 332,000 metric tons," the Associated Press reported just hours before news of the deal was made on Nov. 17. "That's well short of the 12 million metric tons that Agriculture Secretary Brooke Rollins said

lowa State scientists working with plant breeders to improve crop performance

AMES, Iowa - Iowa State University (ISU) scientists are working with plant breeders to look for approaches that can efficiently improve crop performance.

"Genomic selection is an important part of the answer," said Jianming Yu, ISU professor of agronomy, Pioneer Distinguished Chair in Maize Breeding and director of ISU's Raymond F. Baker Center for Plant Breeding.

Genomic selection (GS) is a plant breeding strategy designed to predict measurable traits, studying the relationships between a plant's genetic makeup and its phenotypes to build models that can better predict performance, the researchers said.

The process increases the capacity to evaluate more individual crops and shortens the time required for breeding cycles, the researchers added. It can be used for multiple purposes, including exploring genetic diversity, selecting breeding parents for desired traits, and choosing genetics adapted to future predicted conditions by incorporating environmental variables.

A recent paper entitled, Genomic Selection: Essence, Applications and Prospects, in the scientific journal, The Plant Genome, reviewed GS as part of a special section on crop genetics, genomics and biotechnology. The lead author, Diana Escamilla, a former post-doctoral researcher in Yu's lab, is now a crop breeding specialist in pri-

vate industry. "It was exciting to be invited to write this paper to help people understand genomic selection, why it's important, and how it is evolving," she said. "As in the title, we try to capture the essence of genomic selection and explain how the strategy can allow breeders to more quickly and accurately respond to the needs of farmers and a growing

human population." Yu told Farm World the desire to study GS traces all the way back to when DNA finger printing was developed decades ago: "Researchers always wanted to see how we can determine a plant's genetic potential quickly with DNA molecular markers to reduce the needs of growing it out until the end of the season to see how well it performs. If that is possible, it would greatly im-

prove the breeding efficiency."

He said with much improved genomic technology around the year 2000, the ability to obtain a large number of molecular markers across a set of genetic materials was becoming a reality: "Groundbreaking methodology research in animal science demonstrated in 2001 that it was possible to establish a prediction model with a set of training individuals and then use this model to make predictions about other individuals."

He said plant breeders can use the predicted values to make selection decisions. "In plants, the combination of doubled haploid and other technologies associated with tissue sampling, sequencing and genotyping facilitated the initiation of genomic selection research." Haploid is a plant breeding technique that uses haploid cells to

New pollution laws for CAFOs go into effect in Michigan

(AP) – More than five years after first announcing stricter controls on industrial farm pollution in Michigan, state environmental regulators will finally start enforcing them.

Regulations issued Oct. 29 by the Michigan Department of Environment, Great Lakes and Energy (EGLE) require the state's largest "confined animal feeding operations" - or CAFOs, facilities where cows, pigs and chickens are raised by the hundreds or thousands in confined conditions — to get more aggressive about keeping manure and urine out of Michigan's water.

Under the updated terms of EGLE's general pollution discharge permit, covered facilities are prohibited from spreading manure on farm fields in January through most of March, when it could seep off frozen ground and into nearby waterways. Grassy buffers are required near rivers and creeks. And CAFOs are subject to new reporting requirements, among other changes.

EGLE Director Phil Roos announced the permit decision following years of legal battles with the Michigan Farm Bureau and other farming interests, which had opposed stronger pollution controls the department first unveiled in 2020.

"It has been five-and-a-half years a lot of blood, sweat and tears," Roos said before the announcement.

While farm bureau officials declined

to comment, environmentalists declared a victory for public health and the environment.

Michigan's CAFO industry has expanded threefold since the turn of the millennium and now numbers some 290 large operations that generate more feces and urine than the state's entire human population.

'For the people who live in communities with a very heavy CAFO presence, it's not abstract," said Katie Garvey, a senior attorney with the Environmental Law & Policy Center, which has spent years pushing for stricter regulations. "It's real. It's in their water. It's in their communities."

During the hearing at which Roos announced the permit decision, a farm bureau lawyer seemed to leave open the possibility of an appeal.

"This has been a long five-and-ahalf-year legal process, and we still might not be at the end," said Andrew Kok, the group's legal counsel. He added that farmers "have more interest than anyone in preserving the state's ecosystem for the future."

Unlike traditional farms where livestock graze in pastures, CAFOs are industrial-scale operations that generate massive amounts of waste in small areas.

They typically dispose of it by

spreading or spraying it onto farm fields. In limited amounts, it's a useful fertilizer. But operators often spray far more than plants can absorb, causing excrement to slough off the land and into waterways.

Arguing EGLE had gone too far in its efforts to curb CAFO pollution, farm industry groups mounted an administrative appeal and a lawsuit when EGLE updated its CAFO regulations in 2020. The issue made it all the way to the Michigan Supreme Court, which sided with regulators last year. In a separate ruling, an administrative law judge ruled in January that EGLE has the right to issue the permit, with some modifications.

Roos accepted some of those modifications and rejected others, clearing EGLE to start enforcing the updated

version of the 2020 permit.

Garvey said her group is now turning its attention to making sure CAFO owners follow the new regulations. "We can't sit back and say all right, we're done," Garvey said. "There's still a lot that needs to be done in terms of implementation."

Lake Erie has become a well-known example of the consequences of agricultural pollution. Scientists and regulators have identified manure from CA-FOs as a significant contributor to the toxic algae blooms that turn the lake green every summer.

Michigan vowed in 2015 to reduce phosphorus loads into Lake Erie by 2025, but the state failed to meet that goal and has not set a new deadline to achieve it.

rapidly produce genetically uniform, homozygous lines in just a few generations.

"This was first shown in two scientific papers, one in 2007 and another in 2009," he added. "From then, research and implementation of genomic selection have been widely conducted in both public and private sectors."

He said GS increases the evaluation capacity of breeding programs and reduces the time needed to develop new cultivars, leading to faster crop improvement.

"Genomic selection can be used for exploring genetic diversity, selecting breeding parents, or selecting individuals at different stages of the breeding cycle," he said. "Genomic selection is continuously evolving due to technological advances, research innovations, and emerging challenges in agriculture."

Throughout history, he said, different innovations have been made to increase efficiency of the breeding process, where breeders can identify unique individuals with higher yield, stronger disease resistance, or better nutrition from thousands of plant candidates.

"Genomic selection is regarded as a major innovation in crop breeding," he said. "To help speed up breeding programs and help agriculture meet future challenges, researchers and crop breeders work on all three aspects technology, analytics and design - to come up with solutions to enhance the breeding process and improved cultivars for agricultural production."

The review paper's importance was also recognized in an article in the November 2025 issue of the American Society of Agronomy-Crop Science Society of America-Soil Science Society of America newsletter that shares insights on GS from several of the field's leaders, including Escamilla and Yu.

In spring 2026, Escamilla will return to the ISU campus to lead a seminar on genomic selection and its future, to be hosted by the ISU Department of Agronomy and ISU's Raymond F. Baker Center for Plant Breeding.





trimmed by 80 million pounds to total 27.49 billion. Pork production in 2026 is expected to be nearly the same at 27.48 billion pounds, down 900 million pounds from the September estimate. Pork exports for this year were left unchanged at 6.98 billion pounds and trimmed 400 million pounds for 2026 to 6.96 billion pounds.

The average steer value for 2025 is now estimated at \$225.97 per hundredweight and \$246.00 per cwt for 2026. This was a \$2.60 lower estimate for this year and a \$2.50 cut for next year. The average hog value was lowered by 74 cents per cwt for this year to \$69.08, and increased by \$1 a cwt for 2026 at \$67.

The Brazilian analytical firm CON-AB released its updated 2025/26 supply and demand numbers. CONAB now estimates a Brazil soybean crop of 177.6 mmt, just under the prior 177.64 mmt estimate. The firm's export forecast was left unchanged at 12.1 mmt. Soybean ending stocks are forecast at 13.55 mmt this month, up from last month's 13.38 mmt.

CONAB is now predicting a Brazil corn crop of 138.84 mmt, up from October's 138.6 mmt estimate. Corn exports were also left unchanged this month at 46.5 mmt, and ending stocks were increased from 13.35 mmt last month to a current 13.55 mmt.

On the wheat crop, CONAB sees a crop of 7.69 mmt, steady from October. The Brazil wheat import forecast held at 6.63 mmt, and carryout was bumped up from 1.86 mmt to 1.92 mmt.

The National Oilseed Processor Association soybean crush report for October showed record processing for the month. NOPA members processed a huge 227.65 mbu of soybeans in the month, 18 mbu more than expected and well above the prior 206.6 mbu record from December 2024. The October total was up 15

percent from September and 14 percent more than last October. End of October sov oil stocks totaled 1.3 billion pounds, up 5 percent from September's nine-month low and 21.5 percent more than a year ago. New crop soybean deliveries were a big factor in the higher crush, but so was the addition of two new crush plants in the month. This makes seven new U.S. crush plants for the year.



utilities, ADA accessibility, and other professional spaces that can readily be repurposed into classrooms and labs.

Also, BrightFarms had excavated and prepared land for a future facility expansion, so the space for WC's livestock show arena enjoys construction-ready status. The arena, which will have seating for up to 1,000, will be a venue capable of hosting statewide livestock and equine competition, FFA and 4-H events, and applied learning workshops.

The college asked current ag stu-

dents for input on how best to use the new facility. Morgan Evans is currently studying agricultural business and will be graduating next semester, so she won't benefit from the new space. Yet she was pleased to give suggestions on how she thought it could best be utilized.

"I am excited. It is super cool that the college is getting input from students about what we would like to see and what we would benefit from in our classroom," said Evans, who grew up on a row crop farm in northern Ohio.

"They reached out to a few of us who were heavily involved in the ag program and talked about what careers we were interested in and what the college could benefit from having," she explained. "It was neat to be a part of the process of imagining what it could become."

The facility may allow the college to develop some new programs, to get into the agriculture systems management side of things and the precision side of agriculture, McKay said. It also dovetails well with the college's introduction of a Master of Science in Agriculture degree program starting next fall.

So. while exact plans are still under development, they definitely will hold both agriculture and natural science, and there will be laboratory space. This will enable the college to have smaller class sizes.

"We like to pride ourselves on a 16 to 1 student ratio," McKay said. "In fact, we are now getting classes up to 25 or 30 to one, even 40 to one. Students come to WC because they want that small classroom environment. This is going to allow that to be more true."

Agriculture is the largest major on campus and has been for about two decades, McKay said. It represents about a third of the students. Last year, WC saw a 7 percent increase in enrollment, and ag grew from about 220 students to about 300 students.

"We needed an expansion of facilities, so BrightFarms was the right opportunity at the right time," McKay

WC President Corey Cockerill said that the Agriscience complex will be one of the boldest moves in the nearly 80 years of WC's agriculture program.

Added McKay: "It reflects our commitment to preparing students not just to work in agriculture, but to shape its future, no matter if you were born and raised on a farm or if your first experience with agriculture in our courses."

Giving back, paying forward a natural for the Golden Girls

SIDNEY, Ohio - They've supported events hosted by farm bureau, helped those with 4-H projects and serviced their local schools and community. They've made thousands of cookies, tutored countless numbers of children and have always done their best. to keep "community" in farming. Their decades of commitment to ag literacy and what it means to be part of a county farm bureau are tops among their many goals.

Those in and around southwest Ohio simply know them as the Golden Girls. They are Shelby County Farm

Jill Smith, senior organization director and member development specialist for Ohio Farm Bureau, says the four women have made a difference in the lives of people for this Ohio Farm Bureau, which serves members in Auglaize, Logan, Mercer and Shelby

"For years, I would watch them pull their calendars out of their purses, and those calendars were busier in retirement than they were when they were working," Smith said.

All grew up in 4-H, which is where their volunteerism originated. Peters' mother was a 4-H adviser and Peters was a junior leader at that time. Once married, she became a 4-H adviser herself.

"Volunteering is in the blood, I guess," Peters said. "I have four children and they, too, were in 4-H so it's been pretty much non-stop since then. There's just a lot of opportunities for volunteers in 4-H and farm bureau as

Peters said her entire family has been active with farm bureau in some fashion.

"It's fun to work with people and I enjoy being out with people, learning new ideas. I'm a teacher at heart," Peters said. She is a retired middle school English and language arts teacher. In fact, all four were teachers at some point in their lives.

"After retiring from teaching I imme-

at our local farm bureau office, taking charge of the education committee," Peters said. "Volunteering is what I like to do. It's part of your makeup, doing something for someone else.'

Ohio Farm Bureau was founded on the campus of Ohio State University in 1919, just eight years before Lehmkuhl was born. At 98. Lehmkuhl is the matriarch of this foursome. She became a volunteer at a time when the fledgling farm bureau was in a different world. At that time, some 30 percent of Ohioans lived on farms, Farm bureau was promoting higher fertilizer use to boost the 26 bushels per acre corn yield and fighting to bring electricity to rural ar-

Lehmkuhl has fond memories of volunteering more than seven decades

"I was the chair of the third-grade safety program back then," Lehmkuhl recalled. "The kids were judged in four safety categories. They got to display at the fair. It was a good program. Kids taught their dads how to be safe, how to do things on the farm safer. They took what they learned back to the farm."

For Joslin, perhaps volunteering is in the blood. William and Pearl Joslin. her grandparents-in-law, were part of the first county farm bureau community council in Shelby County. The first project was helping with European food relief after World War II.

The Golden Girls have volunteered at countless events over their years

of service, whether it's helping teach neighbors and students about where their food comes from, telling others about the virtues of farm life or instructing 4-Hers how to bake cookies.

The four are cut from the same cloth. All were raised on a farm and all came from families with a strong tradition of volunteerism and community service. Their dedication to helping others is in their blood, something they don't want to stop doing.

"It's part of your makeup, doing something for someone else," Lehmkuhl said.

"Kids have no connection to the farm anymore," she said. "Many don't know where their milk or eggs come from. Many of kids today haven't been out on a farm."

Steenrod added to that sentiment, saying "farm family children grow up with a work ethic other children do not have, it impacts their whole life."

Added Joslin, "The farm is the best place to raise a family."

Volunteerism has fallen off for many organizations in recent years and farm bureau is no exception. The Golden Girls find that raising a family on a farm and giving back to a community is something they cherish doing,

Winter tree identification clinic set for Crown Hill Cemetery Dec. 17

A real favorite of ours is the Anasazi Bean. We were first introduced to this unusual variety when our good friend Randy Hunsinger of Rushville, Ind., came back from a long-haul delivery out West. Randy gave us a couple of 1-pound packages of the beautiful beans to try. In

When it comes to campfire and kitchen cooked beans, few are as unique as the Anasazi bean. The beans are also known as the "New Mexico Cave Beans," and are native to the Four Corners region of the American Southwest (Colorado, Utah, New Mexico and Arizona).

Anasazi beans date back hundreds of years. The Anasazi people, who once lived in the Four Corners, cultivated the beans as a food crop. The people were known for their innovative farming techniques, which allowed them to thrive in a harsh desert environment. They used a sophisticated system of irrigation canals to water their crops, which included not only Anasazi beans but also corn, squash, and other vegetables.

The Anasazi people believed these beans possessed special spiritual and healing properties, and considered them a sacred food. They incorporated them into many of their traditional ceremonies. Anasazi beans were also

an important trading commodity, and they were exchanged with other Native American tribes throughout the Southwest.

After the Anasazi people disappeared from the area around the year 1300, the cultivation of Anasazi beans declined. The beans fell out of use by most Native American tribes and were largely forgotten for several centuries.

It's been reported but undocumented, in the 1970s a group of farmers in New Mexico discovered some Anasazi beans while exploring abandoned cave dwellings in the region. The beans had been preserved for hundreds of years in the dry desert air, and they were still viable.

The farmers realized these beans had unique characteristics – they were smaller and had a distinct speckled pattern. They started to cultivate them to see if they could grow them commercially. They found the Anasazi beans were not only delicious but also hardy and easy to grow.

Soon, Anasazi beans were being marketed as gourmet beans to restaurants and food stores across the country. People were drawn to their unique look and taste, as well as their historical significance. They became a popular ingredient in many dishes, from soups and stews to salads and dips.

Cooking Anasazi beans is quite simple. They can be cooked on the stovetop, a slow cooker, or an Instant Pot. Here's a basic recipe for preparing Anasazi beans:

The 1.7-mile asphalt multi-use trail was constructed by the city of Crown Point in two phases, with help from a \$2,984,252 grant administered by the DNR.

"Trails are all about making connections between people, communities, and Indiana's great outdoors," said Allen Hurst, DNR trails manager. "DNR is proud to support the completion of the Veterans Memorial Trail in Crown Point just days after Veterans Day. It adds to the increasing number of trails we now have across Indiana."

Crown Point broke ground on the Kindle download.

project's northern section in April. The 1-mile expansion follows the old Pennsylvania Railroad in Crown Point going through the Bridgeport neighborhood, connecting to the Erie Lackawanna Trail on Summit Street. Together with the southern section finished in 2022, nearly 2 miles of paved trail is now open to the public.

"We know everyone is excited to see more connectivity on our bike trail. No matter the season, cyclists, walkers and runners are using our trails," Crown Point Mayor Pete Land said. "We hope this expansion will mark the beginning of further connectivity in our region.'

In addition to the expanded trail, Crown Point, in collaboration with the Indiana Department of Transportation, also completed intersection improvements at Main and Summit streets and at Indiana and North streets, which included pedestrian signals at new crosswalks. The city also constructed a 26-stall parking lot near the new trail.

"When I started working with the city, the team was working on bringing the Erie Lackawanna Trail to Crown Point. It is exciting to see all the connectivity we have been able to provide to our residents and visitors. We look forward to continued bike trail connectivity in Crown Point," said Jennie Burgess, the city's parks director.

directly to Riley Hospital for Children to raise even more money for Riley" to support life-saving care, medical research, and community outreach programs for children facing serious health challenges.



2025 Michigan, Ontario winter wheat winners are announced

LANSING, Mich. - The Michigan YEN play a vital role in helping farmers Wheat Program, Michigan State University, the Grain Farmers of Ontario, the Ontario Ministry of Agriculture, Food & Agribusiness, and the University of Guelph have announced the winners of the 2024-2025 Great Lakes Yield Enhancement Network (YEN) competition. The competition is the culmination of participating wheat farmers' work over the past year.

Great Lakes YEN was established in 2021, as a partnership between farmer-funded wheat organizations on both sides of the border to improve crop returns on winter wheat through greater understanding of crop performance and increased collaboration between industry and farmers. The data-heavy program allows growers to enter and track information on their crop and at year-end, see how they rank amongst their peers. Participating growers receive a 30-page report with detailed information to keep them making gains in wheat production.

The winners of the highest yield in 118 percent 2025 are:

- Nick Suwyn (Wayland, Mich.) -182.7 bushels/acre
- Wayne Metzger (Proton Station, Ontario) - 170.1 bushels/acre
- Ben Wilson (Carson City, Mich.) -156.2 bushels/acre

"Farming today is more technical and knowledge-driven than ever before, and programs like the Great Lakes

understand the science behind their yields," said Paul Hoekstra, vice president, strategic development, Grain Farmers of Ontario. "We congratulate this year's winners, including the program's highest-yielding grower to date, and we look forward to continuing to work with farmers across the region to build on this success."


The highest-yielding grower in the Great Lakes YEN to date is Suwyn, who farms in Allegan County, Mich. He is a long-time participant in the YEN and a double winner this year. He also took home the highest percentage of possible yield achievement.

The YEN also recognizes growers' percentage of possible yield achieved. The variables in this calculation are capture of light energy; conversion efficiency; harvest index and capture of all available water. The winners of the Great Lakes YEN competition for the highest yield potential include:

age yield across all participants reaching over 115 bushels per acre.

Some of the season's winter wheat highlights were:

- Growers in the region successfully seeded winter wheat in Fall 2024, with timely rains aiding establishment despite some regional dryness.
- Snow cover-protected fields, ensuring high survival. Early seeded Ontario and U.S. fields briefly showed snow mold symptoms but, in most cases, recovered quickly.
- Split nitrogen and sulphur applications supported vigorous growth. Stripe rust emerged in Ontario in May, with significant losses only where fungicides weren't applied. The U.S. had late-season smut and bunt issues.
- Cool spring conditions extended fungicide spray windows, while late June heat shortened grain fill in Ontario. In the U.S., windstorms caused localized lodging, but overall yield potential remained strong.
- Ontario reported strong, high-quality yields with very low DON. U.S. harvest quality was mostly excellent, though later rains caused sprouting and falling number issues in some areas. Overall, yields ranged from strong to average, highlighting the benefits of adaptive management.

With five project years now completed, the Great Lakes YEN project has been instrumental in fostering knowledge exchange among farmers seeking innovative methods to enhance their winter wheat yields. This year's Great Lakes YEN project participants will come together in February for wrap-up meetings, providing them with a valuable opportunity to connect and share successful farming practices with their

"Yield increases and percentage of yield achieved are great monitors for farmers to track their gains in winter wheat production," said Jody Pollok-Newsom, executive director of the Michigan Wheat Program. "The detailed, written reports that are compiled and sent to growers provide valuable information on the more than 200 data points they enter on their wheat crop during the growing season.

"Through reviewing those reports to see how their farm stacks up and by participating in our grower networking opportunities, farmers are able to share what works on their farms to enhance their winter wheat yields and decide what they may want to try next year to boost it even more. The Great Lakes YEN is all about gathering data, sharing information and networking with others to grow the best wheat."

EASTWOOD, Ky. - As the fifth generation to be raised on her family's farm, Camyrn Manion brings a wealth of knowledge and experience to her new position as communications director for the Kentucky Corn Growers Association and Kentucky Small Grain Growers Association.

"I grew up on a farm in western Kentucky, which completely shaped my sense of self, my work ethic, and my appreciation for the natural world,' she said. "I did FFA in high school and went on to be the first woman in my family to receive the FFA American Degree. My grandfather, father, and brother have all received their FFA American Degree as well.

"Farmers are incredibly industrious and resourceful, and being raised by two great parents who pushed me to be my best self, led to running multiple of my own businesses before the age of 16; from dog breeding to selling sweet corn at farmers markets," she said. Currently, Manion's parents and brother operate their family farm, growing corn, wheat, and soybeans, along with raising cattle, and running a small peach orchard.

She graduated summa cum laude with a Bachelor of Science in agricultural communications and public relations, and Bachelor of Arts in Spanish from Murray State University's Hutson School of Agriculture, focusing her undergraduate research on language barriers in agriculture.

"After flailing a bit for the right major my first year of college, I finally discovered the agricultural communications track at my university," she said. "It fit

Higher cow inventories credited for increased milk production

The government is back at work however the issue may be revisited next year. The deal funds the government through Jan. 30, 2026, as HighGround Dairy points out, with the exception of agriculture, military construction, veteran's affairs, and the legislative branch. These three were part of a "minibus" appropriations MIELKE MARKET package, and their budgets WEEKLY were approved for one full By Lee Mielke

year. The USDA raised its estimate of 2025 milk output, the eighth consecutive month to do so, in its World Agricultural Supply and Demand Estimates (WASDE) report, citing higher milk cow inventories and robust milk per cow through the third quarter of 2025 as reported in the September Milk Production report. The 2026 forecast was also raised, as the higher inventories and increased productivity are expected to carry into 2026.

2025 production and marketings were projected at 231.4 and 230.5 billion pounds respectively, up 1.4 billion on both from a month ago. If realized, both would be up a hefty 5.5 billion pounds or 2.4 percent from 2024.

2026 production and marketings were projected at 234.3 and 233.3 billion pounds respectively, up 300 million pounds from a month ago. If realized, both would be up 2.9 billion pounds or 1.3 percent from 2025.

The 2025 butter price forecast was reduced as increased supplies of milkfat have resulted in sharply lower prices in third and fourth quarter. Cheese and nonfat dry milk (NDM) prices were also lowered as increased milk supplies put downward pressure on prices. The whey price forecast was raised on strong demand.

Butter, cheese and NDM prices for 2026 were lowered, based on increased milk supplies. The whey price forecast was raised, as strong demand is expected to continue into 2026.

Class III milk prices were reduced, as lower cheese prices more than offset higher whey prices. The 2025 average was lowered a nickel from last month's report, to \$18.15 per hundredweight (cwt.), and compares to \$18.89 in 2024 and \$17.02 in 2023. The 2026 average was raised 25 cents to \$17.65 per cwt.

Class IV milk prices were reduced on lower butter and NDM prices. Look for the 2025 average to come in at \$17.35 per cwt., down 80 cents from a month ago, and compares to \$20.75 in 2024 and \$19.12 in 2023. The 2026 average was projected at \$14.50, down \$2.75 from last month's estimate.

U.S. dairy exports totaled 235,210 MT in August, up 3.7 percent from August 2024, but down on a monthly basis for the second month in a row. HighGround Dairy says, "Trade woes earlier in 2025, when July and August's sales were likely booked, probably weighed on values, causing them to fall. Softness in some of the powders, specifically, whey protein concentrate 80 percent protein, lactose, and nonfat dry milk/skim milk powder shipments drug the totals down."

.Cheese exports totaled an impressive 119.3 million pounds, up 28.1 percent from a year ago, a record high on a 30-day adjusted basis, according to HighGround's Cara Murphy in the Nov. 24 Dairy Radio Now broadcast, and was the fourth time in 2025 that a new highwater mark was set, "highlighting just how much cheese the U.S. has sent abroad." Mexico was the top destination, with a 31 percent market share, followed by South Korea, Japan and Australia. Cheddar set a record for the third time in 2025, with 24.3 million pounds exported, up 139.7 percent.

She warned, however, that European cheese prices fell substantially in October and are trending around \$1.50 per pound, very close to those in the U.S. so 2026 exports may not look as strong as those in

Butter sailings, at 17.7 million pounds, fell from July's level, but were up 190.5

percent from a year ago. HighGround adds that U.S. butter imports slowed to their lowest level since January 2021. New Zealand and European butter prices remain at about \$1.50 premium to the U.S. so U.S. exports may remain strong, she said.

Nonfat/skim milk powder exports amounted to 124.4 million pounds, down 17.6 percent as U.S. prices are



not competitive globally. Exports to Mexico were down sharply as were sailings to the Philippines and Indonesia. Dry whey exports totaled 39.9 million pounds, up 10.6 percent from 2024, with strong sales to China.

The world has plenty of milk, according to Murphy, and output is up substantially in Europe and New Zealand, even in Latin America and Chi-

Speaking of China, the latest data shows October whey product imports hit 142.3 million pounds, up 14.4 percent from a year ago, highest October on record, according to HighGround Dairy. The U.S. saw increased sales but was "somewhat surprising, given the Chinese government's recent directive to reduce hog production, though it may still be too early for that policy to materially affect whey demand for pig feed."

The U.S. remains the top origin for lactose imports, though October volumes slipped 2.6 percent. Yearto-date, U.S. market share has also declined from 74 percent in 2024 to just 60 percent, says HighGround, "as trade disputes continue to weigh on Chinese purchases of U.S. goods.'

Cheese imports, at 28.4 million pounds, were up 30.7 percent. Butter amounted to 12.5 million pounds, down 4.4 percent.

CME cash block cheese, after plunging almost 24 cents the previous three weeks, was trading Thursday morning at \$1.56, up 2 cents on the week so far but 8.50 cents below a year ago, as traders anticipated Friday afternoon's October Milk Production and August Dairy Production reports. It closed Friday at \$1.54. The barrels were at \$1.6050 Thursday, lowest since March 21, 2025, after finishing Friday at \$1.6425.

Central region cheese producers continued to run busy schedules this week to fill orders, according to Dairy Market News, as many facilities will take some downtime Thanksgiving week. Milk production is steady in the region and some plants were sending larger than normal volumes of spot milk to bottlers. Class III spot demand is moderate as some cheesemakers reported multiple spot sales of milk. Prices at mid-week ranged \$1.50-under to \$1.50 over class. Retail cheese demand is strong and exports strengthened this week due to lower CME prices.

Cheese manufacturers in the West report Class III spot milk varies from steadily available to tighter. Cheese production is strong as we approach the remaining 2025 holidays. Domestic cheese demand is flat to strengthening. Export demand is steady to strong, according to DMN.

Butter continued its meltdown, falling to \$1.4775 per pound Thursday, lowest since Feb. 26, 2021, and \$1.0625 below a year ago. It closed Friday at \$1.5750.

There is no shortage of milk in the Central region, says DMN, and components are up significantly from last year. Cream was becoming more available as the holiday approached. Churns are operating at or near capacity, but some plants are planning for slower production Thanksgiving week. There were some spot sales of cream to churns this week, but the majority went to Class II and III producers as multiples are higher for those commodities.

Retail butter sales have increased dramatically. Store promotions are up in frequency and prices are dropping, contributing to the increased sales. Food service sales are light, with little reported activity. Export demand is steady, with domestic 82 percent butterfat butter remaining competitive on the global market, according to DMN.

Bids flowed for Michigan on-farm brewery gear

FENNVILLE, Mich. - On Nov. 12, Miedema's OrbitBid presented an unusual liquidation auction: the equipment, furnishings and other assets of the former on-farm Waypost Brewing Co. The business - known for its craft-style beers and farm-to-glass approach - closed this past December. The auction provided a rare opportunity for anyone looking to step into the brewing business, with almost 200 lots, including a well-maintained brewhouse system, canning and bottling equipment, tanks, and other brewing essentials, along with tasting-room furnishings, beer-garden decor, and even some heavy machinery up for grabs.

While its \$4,050 winning bid wasn't the event's highest, the core of the auction was nonetheless a DME Brewing Solutions Brew House System. It included a 10-barrel, two-vessel steam-jacketed mash/lauter tun, a kettle/whirlpool liquor blending system, and a digital control panel, as well as a Mueller heat exchanger and glycol-jacketed tanks – the foundation to brew on a large scale.

Nearby was a Wild Goose "Gosling A" series single-head canner that fetched the auction's top bid of \$15,050. This canning unit included a 47-by-31-inch rolling table with a thick poly top, assorted filters and a variety of accessories.

Other portions of the brewing outfit included a DME model YKEGWSH 4-head manual keg washer/filler for 220V, single-phase, 35-amp electric, which sold for \$5,550; a Fluid Chillers, Inc. AIR10000-DC-LT-OD-SPEC-2CT glycol chiller with two 5-hp tandem compressors and a digital temperature controller for 230V single-phase electric, which brought \$5,150; and an 8-barrel Foeder Crafters of America oak foeder with chilling plates and

plastic tubing connected to the glycol manifold, that went for \$2,525.

Smaller accessories included a selection of fermentation vessels, including three separate 10-barrel glycol-jacketed tanks selling between \$775 and \$1,025. Two 20-barrel fermentation tanks picked up \$510 and \$560, respectively. Other items, such as hoses and measuring instruments, also proved popular. A collection of three 10-foot-long 1-inch-diameter Continental Vintner Reserve 250-psi food-grade hoses with quick-connect ends went for \$510. A Hanna Instruments H170300 beer refractometer, bundled with electrode storage solu-

I loved looking at bull photos and tried to memorize all the important herd sires. My bedroom at home, which was actually a sunporch which doubled as my mom's sewing room, was covered in bull pictures and I often wondered what her customers who came for fittings thought of all the

bulls leering at them as they tried on their new clothes.

Back when we didn't have EPD's beef cattle were evaluated mostly on their phenotype and as a junior member of the Angus Association I sent away for three free posters that depicted what an ideal Angus bull, cow and steer should look like. These became the centerpiece of my art collection. As a sophomore in high

school, I could rattle off all the names of the best sires but then the continental breed explosion hit and with 35 breeds I became more confused than Joe Biden.

Today I can't even keep up with all the purebred ranch names. There's Man Herefords, Halfmann Red Angus and Assman Land and Cattle (I bet they like cattle with big butts.) There's a King Ranch in Texas, California and New Mexico. There's a Bear Creek, Wolf Creek and Oak Creek, not to be confused with Town Creek. The famed R.A. Brown Ranch in Texas breeds some of the best red and black





bulls but no BROWN ones, while Redd Ranches in Paradox, Colo., is known for their Red Angus, Red Gelbvieh and red Simmental. There's both a Funk and Fink who have among the finest purebred herds in America. The Funk family owns Express Ranches and the Fink Family owns Fink Family Genetics. As I slowly lose my memory you can see how I could get Dudley Brothers and Nunley Brothers confused as well as 12 Star and 5 Star. Don't even get me started on Black Herefords, miniature Angus or genetically enhanced EPD's. How is anyone supposed to remember all these EPD's for every breed? You can't compare the numbers across breeds unless you know calculus and every time I finally figure out what are good numbers for the Angus breed they come up with a bunch of new numbers, not to mention new categories.

What really blows my mind is that all these purebred outfits have to come up with hundreds of thousands of new names for the cattle they register.

I don't know how the biggest outfits come up with 2,000 or more names for their registered cattle EVERY YEAR. I know one ranch that named their cattle after U.S. presidents one year and football players another year. Baxter Black even had a bull named after him and Baxter told me he considered it his highest honor.

Another publication I studied in our ag library was the Quarter Horse Journal because one local horseman donated all his past copies. I love horse names the best and often find them funny, like Peptoboonsmal. Over the years I've kept a list of names I'd use if I ever became a big time Quarter Horse breeder and here's just a sampling: Who Flung Dung, Bedpan, Neutered, Abadapple, Better Than Terrible, Gesundheit, Pie Biter, The Flatulator, Horse Remorse, It's Only Money, Jorge Palomino, Hubba Hubba, Stew Meat, 4DBirdz, Back Seat Driver, Lucky Sperm and Crow Bait.

If you ever see a racehorse at the track with any of these names you'll know it's me so if you want to double your money, just take the cash you were going to bet, fold it in half and put it back in your pocket.

tion, and a bag of 3mL plastic dropper tools fetched \$155. And, a set of four brewery sight glasses went for \$110.


Kegs were plentiful and sold in bulk, with winning bids ranging from \$930 for a collection of 26 pony (1/6 barrel) varieties to \$2,650 for a set of 48 half-barrel kegs. Oak barrels sold similarly, spanning from \$111 for a batch of seven weather-worn barrels that had been stored outdoors to a tidy \$610 for a lot of six good-condition barrels complete with three Barrels Direct stacking stands.

Tasting room furnishings and accouterments included a 12-tap keg setup, with brass tap handles, tubing, and associated hardware, that hammered at \$370. A Square point-of-sale system, complete with an Epsilont cash drawer, Star TSP1000 high-capacity receipt printer, and other accessories, was grabbed for \$280. Multiple lots containing four Goebel & Co. steel-framed bar stools with carvedwood tractor-style seats, each sold in the low \$200s.

From the beer garden came items like a custom-made 135-by-50-inch horseshoe-shaped wood bench that pulled \$410. Several 75-by-15-by 22inch raised wooden garden beds on metal legs sold for around \$200 each. An 18-by-6-by-10-foot roofed outdoor seating area, holding three six-foot picnic tables, went for just \$85.

The auction also featured several vehicles and pieces of heavy machinery. Leading the way, at \$7,450, was a specialized 2016 R&D Interstate I610TA2 trailer. The fully-enclosed trailer was equipped with a Chandler dual fan refrigeration unit, six beer taps, and a six-foot drip area, along with a dual axle, aluminum exterior, stainless steel fenders, dual swinging rear doors, brake-away system, crankstyle landing gear, and a 2-5/16-inch ball for towing.
