NCGA president discusses bringing profitability back to corn farmers

BLOOMINGTON, Ill. — The new and immediate past presidents of the National Corn Growers Association (NCGA) were in attendance at the annual meeting of the Illinois Corn Growers Association, held November 25 at the Illinois Corn Agri-Center. During a brief speech, new NCGA President Jed Bower, a corn grower from Washington Court House, Ohio, promised those in attendance, including former NCGA president and corn farmer Ken Hartman of Waterloo, Illinois, that he would make the rural economy and market expansion for corn his top priorities.

"Weve got a big fight ahead, but I know that we at NCGA and all of you are ready for that," said Bower, who took over from Hartman on October 1 after serving the prior year as vice president of the organization's board and a member of several key NCGA committees, including the finance committee. He begins his presidency as corn growers face the largest three-year decline in net cash receipts in history due to declining crop farm profitability associated with lower prices and elevated input costs.

"Looking ahead at some of NCGA's priorities and my priorities for the next coming year, ethanol blends are at the top, but my true number-one priority is this: I want to bring profitability back to the American corn farmer. Ethanol is going to be a key to that. Hopefully we can get (year-round) E-15 soon, because we have to get to higher blends. Obviously, market access is (also) huge," said Bower, who is currently working to secure a full, 16-year extension to the U.S.-Mexico-Canada (USMCA) trade agreement.

The new NCGA president promised to tackle out-of-control input costs, especially for fertilizers. To that end, NCGA has established a special committee to examine drivers behind the continued rise in input costs, and ways to mitigate them.

Bower was effusive in his praise for the job Hartman did during his year as president, along with his assistance in helping him transition into the association's top leadership role. "Kenny has been such a mentor to me moving forward. In fact, my hair is starting to look a little like his," Bower said, grinning towards his silver-haired friend and colleague.

"Seriously, we've seen Kenny everywhere this year, pushing back on the administration, pushing back on MAHA; Kenny truly had no fear when it came to pushing the interests of the corn growers, and we appreciated that all across farm country."

Following his brief address to ICGA leadership and members, Bower told Farm World there are a "couple of keys" to achieving his goal of returning profitability to corn farmers. "We have to keep pushing ethanol, we have to keep driving the export markets and bring this price up. We also have to look at the other side; what are farmers paying to put a crop out? It looks pretty high from our farm, so I want to make sure we have a balance between what we're getting out of our crop and what we're putting into it," he said.

Bower vowed to seek new ways to minimize the impact of monopoly-driven prices set by fertilizer, chemical and machinery companies. "We are getting gouged as the American corn farmer, it's not a fair practice, and I think we've got to bring a light to that," he said.

Increasing domestic ethanol demand in the short-term, another priority of Bower's and the NCGA, could depend on whether year-round E15 is pushed over the finish line by Congress and signed into law before the end of the year, according to Bower. "If we get E15 over the line, that's going to bring approximately another 2 to 2.5 billion bushels of corn out of the piles and into the gas tank," he said. "From there we have to continue to push to drive higher blends, look at a national high octane clean fuel standard and push ethanol around the world in the export market along with corn in all forms."

NCGA leaders have ramped up

Indiana's net farm income projected to rise this year but then fall in 2026

INDIANAPOLIS – Indiana's net farm income will increase this year, but is expected to drop in 2026, according to a report from Purdue University and the Rural & Farm Finance Policy Analysis Center at the University of Missouri.

This year's farm income is projected to be \$4.71 billion, up 45 percent from 2024, the report said. In 2026, farm income is expected to fall 34 percent to \$3.1 billion. The Fall 2025 Farm Income Outlook For Indiana was released in October.

"The expansion of 2025 net farm income is mainly due to increased livestock receipts and direct government payments," the report said. "Direct government payments are projected to total \$891.01 million. This is \$773.39 million higher than in 2024, mostly attributed to financial assistance to mitigate the effects of economic- and disaster-related losses in recent years, including 2024."

Crop receipts in 2025 are projected to decline 6 percent, driven by lower soybean production and lower corn prices, the report noted. Livestock receipts are projected to increase 14 percent, mainly due to higher cash receipts for eggs, hogs and pigs, and turkeys, the report said.

"The decrease in corn receipts is mainly driven by the projected 9 percent drop in average annual corn prices that offset higher production volumes with higher yields," the report said. Soybean receipts will decline "due to a 6 percent reduction in planted area and a 3 percent drop in soybean production. A 16 percent lower wheat price and 4 percent lower production in 2025 are the main drivers of the drop in cash receipts."

For livestock cash receipts, eggs are expected to increase 21 percent this year, while hog receipts are expected to go up 17 percent. Dairy receipts are projected to drop 2 percent, and receipts for cattle and calves are expected to increase 1 percent.

"The report correctly identifies government transfer payments for 2025 as a driver of net farm income," Dr. Todd Davis, Indiana Farm Bureau chief economist, told Farm World. "Some of these payments are included in the 2026 forecast, but at lower levels than in 2025. USDA had discussed a type of liquidity bridge for 2026 before the government shutdown. I am unsure of the likelihood of a bridge payment to help with 2026, but the liquidity concern remains an issue."

As for 2026, Davis said he's not surprised that net farm income is forecast to decline.

"The initial 2026 forecast assumes trend yields for corn and soybeans, which are lower than the record yields for the 2025 crops," he explained. "The 2026 price forecast reflects the September 2025 outlook, which was bearish for 2025 corn and soybeans, and that bearish sentiment carried into 2026.

"The forecast of lower prices for 2026 is reasonable, but weather events in Argentina and Brazil could reduce the size of the crops currently being planted. Smaller South American corn and soybean production would support higher prices for the U.S. crops."

In 2026, the report said corn receipts are expected to drop 3 percent due to lower production. Soybean receipts are projected to remain steady. Livestock receipts are expected to de-

pressure on Congress to pass the Nationwide Consumer and Fuel Retailer Choice Act of 2025, which would eliminate a clause in the Clean Air Act preventing sales of fuel with 15 percent ethanol blends or greater during the summer. A change will provide more predictability and boost demand for corn, according to Bower and NCGA.

A fifth-generation grower, Bower farms with his wife, Emily, and children, Ethan and Emma, in Fayette County, Ohio. His term as NCGA president will expire on October 1, 2026, the beginning of the next fiscal NCGA

cline, with egg receipts projected to fall 38 percent. Hog receipts are expected to drop 3 percent, while dairy receipts are projected to increase 2 percent.

"For some corn and soybean farmers, the 2026 crop year could be the third or fourth consecutive year with negative margins," Davis pointed out. "Farmers have been cutting costs, and this trend will likely continue. However, the easiest cost savings have already been achieved. The harder cost savings involve machinery management, decisions on cash rental rate bids, and finding savings in the farm-family living expense budgets."

He said farmers should fine-tune their 2026 enterprise and cash flow budgets. They should develop a pre-harvest and post-harvest marketing plan with pricing objectives and quantities priced at each objective. The marketing plan, Davis said, will help farmers manage their decisions without letting bullish emotions or bearish fears drive them.

"The study uses state-level sector analysis which masks the farm-level

financial impact," he said. "For example, a diversified crop/livestock farm is weathering the storm better than a farm only producing row crops. Most farms specialize in a single enterprise, such as corn/soybeans or hogs, rather than being diversified across multiple enterprises. Currently, the crop-only farms are feeling financial stress.

"Young and beginning farmers who rent a larger percentage of their land base to grow their business are under greater stress than those who own a large percentage of their land base. Business growth includes machinery debt as farms increase the field capacity of their machinery. A growing farm may also have a growing family with living expenses that are not easily curbed."

Similar reports were also prepared for Illinois and Iowa. Illinois net farm income is projected to increase 21 percent to \$6.25 billion in 2025, and fall 28 percent next year. In Iowa, net farm income is expected to rise 76 percent to \$12.32 billion in 2025. Next year, it is projected to drop 24 percent.

Nationally, net farm income is projected to be \$179.85 billion in 2025, up 41 percent, the report said.

COATESVILLE, Ind. – Harvest in west central Indiana was fast and furious this fall, according to Coatesville, Ind., farmer Mark Legan, after receiving only half an inch of rain in both August and September.

"After a wet start and ample moisture through July, soybeans were five to seven bushel per acre off our five-year average, and corn was right at the five-year average," he told Farm World as he wrapped up the 2025 harvest season. been very dry. A few recent rains have helped replenish top soil moisture, while subsoil remains dry."

In its final Crop Progress Report for this year, released Nov. 24, the USDA said the U.S. soybean harvest is officially complete and the corn harvest is nearly finished at 96 percent to 97 percent complete. Winter wheat planting is 97 percent complete, with emergence at 87 percent, cotton harvest at 79 percent complete, and sorghum harvest at 91 percent complete.

Justin Glisan, state climatologist of Iowa, told Farm World, "Much of the Ag Belt is experiencing drier conditions, and have had drier conditions through much of fall. This is reflected in drought expansion across segments of (the Midwest and the Appalachians) region. Soil moisture, both top and sub-, have been trending drier as well."

He said, "Drought and abnormal dryness span much of the eastern Corn Belt, with D2 (severe drought) to D3 (extreme drought) conditions from eastern Illinois to northwest Ohio. This swath represents the driest parts of the Ag Belt.

"There are also pockets of D1 to D2 conditions across much of Minnesota, Wisconsin, and Michigan,"

he added. "Portions of the western Corn Belt have fared better, with pockets of D1 (moderate drought) in Iowa, Nebraska, and South Dakota."

The report said in Indiana, corn harvested was 97 percent complete, winter wheat planted was 94 percent complete, and winter wheat emerged at 77 percent. In Illinois, corn harvested was 99 percent complete, winter wheat planted was 98 percent complete, and winter wheat emerged at 87 percent.

In Michigan, corn harvested was 92 percent complete, winter wheat planted was 100 percent complete, and winter wheat emerged at 99 percent. In Ohio, corn harvested was 98 percent complete, winter wheat planted was 99 percent complete, and winter wheat emerged at 97 percent.

In Kentucky, corn harvested was 99 percent complete. In Tennessee, corn harvested was 99 percent complete, and cotton was 92 percent complete. In Iowa, corn harvested was 99 percent complete.

Glisan said outlooks into the middle of December show higher probabilities of colder temperatures from the High Plains to the Appalachians: "On the precipitation side, there's a bullseye of drier chances centered on Iowa, and stretching into Missouri, and many of the bordering states. There are higher chances of wetter conditions from the eastern Corn Belt to the Appalachians."


The next weekly USDA Crop Progress Report is slated to be released in early April 2026, the agency said.

US/China trade remains slow

Traders are becoming increasingly disappointed in the lack of Chinese business since the recent trade agreement was announced. China's minister of commerce has now stated China wants to do more business with the U.S., but wants "a competitive price, good quality and sufficient supply" from a soybean trade partner. Price is the hang-up for U.S. soybeans

as tariffs make ours the most expensive going into China. China has picked up its buying pace recently, but not consistently. China has agreed to buy 12 million metric tons of soybeans from the U.S. this marketing year that ends next August.

It is no secret China has been absent from the U.S. soybean market this year, but their buying from other sources has been quite active. This has led to record soybean stocks in China, with a port inventory reported at 10.3 mmt on Nov. 7. This compares to last year's 3.6 mmt. Soybean crushers are also reporting a soybean inventory of 7.5 mmt, the highest volume since 2017. This has started to limit China's soybean appetite from any source, especially the U.S. since we are the highest priced source in the global market.

Tariff uncertainty is weighing on all export trade as the odds of the Supreme Court supporting President Donald Trump's tariffs is falling and now below 25 percent. A bigger question is if these tariffs are deemed illegal, will the U.S. have to repay the \$200 billion in tariffs it has already collected. Importers are hesitant to book excessive volumes of U.S. commodities with the possibility of these fees being removed.

The state of the U.S. economy is becoming more of a market factor. Labor data shows U.S. layoffs in the month of October totaled 153,000, the highest number in 22 years. This brings unemployment data


for the calendar year to 1
million, the highest since
2020. These job losses are
being credited to increased
use of Artificial Intelligence
and businesses needing to

cut expenses due to elevated tariffs costs. These losses may support further intertest rate cuts but will have a considerable impact on consumer spending.

This lack of consumer confidence was noted in the monthly report from the University of Michigan. According to U of M data, U.S. consumer confidence dropped by over 6 percent from a final October reading of 58.6 to a current index reading of 52.3. This decline was the result of a 17 percent decline in personal finances and an 11 percent decline in forward business expectations. The current sentiment reading is 50.3 which is also lower than the October index reading of 53.6. These readings, when combined with statements from the White House that some segments of the U.S. economy are in a recession, are starting to impact U.S. investor confidence.

One positive economic indicator was another decline in global food costs for the month of October. The United States' Food and Agriculture Organization, the group that monitors world food costs, showed an index reading of 126.4 in October, down from 128.5 in September. This



was the second consecutive month of declines. Global food costs had been creeping up, but peaked in July at a two-year high, and have now started to decline. This is mainly from a record world cereal grain production estimate of 2.99 billion mt, up 4.4 percent from a year ago. World food costs are now 21 percent off their March 2022 high.

The Brazilian analytical firm Safras updated its corn production figures for the country. Safras is now predicting a 2025/26 Brazil corn crop of 143.56 mmt, up from its prior estimate of 142.49 mmt. This increase was from a bump in the first crop estimate from a prior 25.47 mmt to a current 27.76 mmt. Favorable weather to start the growing season and an increase in plantings are behind the larger forecast. The USDA forecasted a Brazilian corn crop of 131 mmt in the September WASDE report.

China has also revised its 2025/26 production data. Chinese authorities are expecting a soybean crop of 20.9 mmt this year, nearly matching the USDA projection for 21 mmt. The country's soybean imports for 2025/26 were held at 95.8 mmt, well below the 109.4 mmt from the 2024/25 marketing year. China maintains a corn crop forecast of 295 mmt despite considerable flood damage that not only was reported to impact production but also quality. Many private analysts have taken upward of 10 mmt off China's forecasted crop. China is also only forecasting corn imports of 6 mmt this, half of recent years' purchases.

The November cattle on feed report

showed a Nov, 1 U.S. feedlot inventory of 11.7 million head. This was 2 percent less than a year ago and the lowest total in 75 years. October cattle placements were down a large 10 percent from a year ago at 1.99 million head. This was the lowest October placement total on record. October marketings were down 8 percent from last year at 1.7 million head. Even with the U.S. resuming Brazil beef imports, until these inventory numbers increase, cattle values will remain elevated.

Despite record U.S. beef cattle values, the U.S. dairy herd continues to expand. Data shows the dairy herd totaled 9.15 million head at the end of September, an increase of 36,000 head from August. This was also a large 235,000 head more than the U.S. had milking a year ago. As a result, U.S. milk production has increased 4 percent year to year, and pressured that complex over the past several months.

Compared to last Monday the feeder market was lower with an average quality offering. Feeder steers and heifers were sharply lower across all weight classes with a good supply and moderate demand. Continued negative pressure in the futures market coupled with it being a holiday week limited buyers interests and the premiums they were willing to pay today. Slaughter cows were mostly steady with a good supply and slaughter bulls were 3.00 to 5.00 higher with strong demand for higher yielding individuals. Supply included: 84% Feeder Cattle (38% Steers, 39% Heifers, 21% Bulls, 2% Dairy Heifers); 15% Slaughter Cattle (79% Cows, 16% Bulls, 4% Dairy Cows); 1% Replacement Cattle (57% Stock Cows, 14% Bred Cows, 14% Cow-Calf Pairs, 14% Bulls). Feeder cattle supply over 600 lbs was 55%.

Star of the West Milling Company consolidates 2 mills into new facility

QUINCY, Mich. — Two wheat flour mills are being consolidated into a new and much larger operation in northern Indiana.

Star of the West Milling Company, one of the largest millers in North America, has announced its flour mill in Quincy, Mich., will close on or about January 1. A mill in Ligonier, Ind., closed a few months ago.

The company built a new mill in Ligonier which has the capacity to produce as much as two million pound of flour per day. In comparison, the mill in Quincy has a daily capacity of 340,000 pounds of flour while the old mill in Ligonier could generate as much as 820,000 pounds of flour a day.

"Our company grew in its ability to make flour but we did it in one facility instead of two," said Mike Fassezke, President of the company's flour milling division. Fassezke said the elevator at the mill in Quincy will remain open and continue to store wheat from growers in southern Michigan and northern Indiana until it's shipped to the new facility for grinding into flour.

The bulk truck washing operation at the mill will also remain open to sanitize the inside of the trailers used to haul wheat after delivery.

The 15 or so workers in Quincy have been offered job opportunities at the new facility and the firm's mill in Frankenmuth, Mich., where the firm is headquartered, according to company officials.

The company also has mills in Willard, Ohio, and Churchville, New York. Fassezke said a majority of their flour is shipped in bulk to large makers of cookies, donuts, cake mixes and other similar products within a 300-mile radius of each mill.

He said the decision to consolidate the two mills had a lot to do with reducing operating expenses to remain competitive in the industry at a time when consumption of wheat flour in the U.S. has been stagnant over the past several years. "It's all about efficiencies and scale of operations and that type of thing. If you want to survive, you got to move on," he said.

Fassezke said money could have been spent on renovating the old mills but given their age and lower production capacities, building a new mill with room for future growth in production was felt to be a better return on the investment.

"We could have remodeled it. We could have put all new equipment in it but you're still operating in a very, very old structure," he said. Fassezke noted other flour milling companies in recent years have been replacing their old with newer, much larger and more efficient operations. "We're not the only ones following that strategy," he said. Fassezke said the new mill being just a one hour or so drive from the one about to close made what was a difficult decision a little easier because it can serve the company's entire existing customer base.

Star of the West Milling Company began over 150 years ago in Frankenmuth in what was small steam-powered mill, according to the company. In addition to flour, the firm is also a supplier of edible beans, food grade soybeans and ready-to-eat wheat flakes.

It also has an agronomy division consisting of more than 30 certified crop advisors that work directly with farmers along with 30 elevators and five bean processing facilities.



INFB awards grants to to promote ag literacy programs

INDIANAPOLIS - The Indiana Farm Bureau (INFB) has awarded grants totaling more than \$9,200 to four 4-H clubs and eight FFA chapters for new or enhanced ag literacy programs in their communities, the organization said Nov. 6.

This year, the annual Ag Literacy Challenge Grant program awarded funds ranging from \$250 to \$1,000, and will be used for activities taking place from October 2025 to August 2026, INFB said. The categories include events that help consumers become better informed about Indiana agriculture, or promote agricultural practices and policies or education efforts that stimulate action in the ag community.

"FFA and 4-H play such an important role in ag education and leadership development opportunities for Indiana's youth," Randy Kron, INFB president, said in a release. "The programs highlight a variety of Indiana agriculture and spread awareness of the importance of our industry."

Hoosier FFA chapters and 4-H clubs could apply for grants of up to \$1,000 during the grant cycle, INFB said. Grant recipients are required

to submit a report to INFB after their ag literacy program is complete in addition to presenting their program to their local county farm bureau, INFB noted.

The Rensselaer Central FFA chapter in Jasper County received \$800

for its Fall Harvest Meals program, according to McKenna Wilson, Rensselaer Central High School agriculture teacher. The event, which was completed Oct. 25, provided free meals to farmers during harvest.

"This idea was formulated when

students put their heads together on figuring out how they could thank all of the farmers in the community with more than just a thank you card," Wilson said. "FFA members understood that the days in the field can be long and meals are not always easy to get lined up. By preparing the harvest meals and handing them out at an easily accessible location, students knew that they could reach farmers near and far."

Wilson said enough food was prepared for 250 meals, and more than 200 were distributed at two locations - Parr Elevator and the Jasper County Farm Bureau office.

"The remainder of the meals were given to those that helped put on the event," she noted. "Setting up shop at the local elevator was a great success because truck drivers were able to fill their stomach and haul a box of meals back to everyone in the fields.'

This was the second year for the program. Next year, the group hopes to hand out another 200 meals, Wil-

This year, five students helped fix the meals early in the morning and 10 passed out meals at the pickup locations.

"These students certainly gained networking skills," she said. "When we started, everyone was too shy to pass any meals out and by the end of the day it was a competition to see who could give out the most.

"Getting out in the community and becoming familiar with businesses is certainly an important thing for these young kids to do, which is why continuing these community outreaches are important for our FFA chapter."

With two Ag Literacy Grants and additional support from the Elkhart County 4-H Club Council, the county's 4-H program received \$2,500 for its elementary school garden and camp program, said Corey Sharp, the county's 4-H youth development Ex-

tension educator. "The gardening activities provide a great experience and allow the kids to learn about plant science, gardening techniques, food supply and production systems, and entrepreneurship," he said. "We want the kids to have a better appreciation of locally grown foods as well as the importance of our

local farming community. "The gardening activities offer students a rich, hands-on learning experience. Our goal is to help students develop a deeper appreciation for locally grown food and a better understanding of the vital role our local farming community plays."

The next garden program will begin in January and conclude in July, Sharp said. Students will start by planting seeds and caring for their plants throughout the spring, leading into hands-on activities during summer camp, he said. The program will end with the students submitting their garden projects for judging at the Elkhart County 4-H Fair.

Students at St. Vincent DePaul School and Mary Daly Elementary participated in the gardening programs this past season. Both sites used indoor greenhouses to start their plants.

St. Vincent students and volunteers built and planted three raised garden beds, Sharpe said. At Mary Daly, students created their own individual container gardens, which they took home.

The Ag Literacy Challenge program began in 2021, and evolved into its current format last year, said Annie Romine, INFB youth engagement coordinator. Over the last two years, INFB awarded nearly \$19,000 to Indiana FFA chapters and 4-H clubs.

Warsaw couple named KFB 2025 **Outstanding Young Farm Family**

WARSAW, Ky. - Big successes can come from small beginnings. Just ask young farmers Taylor and Hannah Jones of Gallatin County, Ky.

Fifteen years ago (and just two years out of high school) Taylor developed a small business plan for locally grown tomatoes. It was part of a class project while he was in college. The couple now manages a diversified operation in northern Kentucky, producing row crops, beef cattle, hemp and yes, tomatoes. Their community-supported agriculture (CSA) and home-delivery program supplies fresh produce and beef to thousands of households across the state each summer.

Their efforts haven't gone unrecognized as Kentucky Farm Bureau (KFB) presented the couple with its 2025 Outstanding Young Farm Family Award.

This annual award recognizes a young couple or individual who demonstrates excellence in agricultural management, innovation and leadership, while maintaining strong community engagement and active involvement with the farm bureau federation.

For Taylor and Hannah, it wasn't always easy.

"We've faced plenty of setbacks and had to get creative more than once." Taylor said. "But every challenge taught us how to adapt, how to make better decisions and how to build something that lasts for our family and our employees."

The couple wear many hats. They manage everything from data analysis and spreadsheets to coordinating daily worker schedules and operating farm equipment, including the combine harvester.

Over the past decade, the couple has grown their business steadily, creating local employment opportunities and demonstrating a commitment to innovation and long-term sustainability.



We farm because we love doing it, we love putting seeds in the ground, we love producing a crop and most of all we enjoy managing the chaos so that in the end everything turns out OK," Taylor said.

The Joneses say hemp is their largest type of enterprise, along with a lot of beef cattle. But their production of produce reigns supreme on the farm, with wholesale watermelons and wholesale tomatoes atop the list.

"From all the produce we started our home delivery business," Taylor said. "We began with produce and eventually started advertising freezer

"We know we're providing good food and that's a good feeling, but it's not the same feeling as when you deliver it to someone's doorstep or into their kitchen. There's a lot about farming that makes you feel good about what you're doing."

Hannah added, "There's nothing like producing something you're proud of."

Looking back, Taylor built on the traditional farming knowledge passed down from his grandfather, who raised tobacco and cattle. Taylor combined those roots with the technical and entrepreneurial skills he gained while earning a degree in agricultural education.

Hannah, who holds degrees in exercise science and nursing, joined Taylor after their marriage in 2020. Together they have built a thriving family farm while raising two daugh-



Three-Day Kraft auction drew bidders to farm classics and collectibles

VALPARAISO, Ind. — Kraft Auction Service drew attention November 13–15 during its huge three-day, third annual fall antique truck and tractor auction. Held at its Valparaiso facility, each day brought a fresh lineup - spanning vintage farm machine literature and memorabilia, antique tractors, vehicles, and even quality farm toys.

Things opened Thursday, with an online-only session featuring antique/vintage machinery literature and memorabilia. More than 500 lots were offered,

including dealer catalogs, instruction manuals, ag-themed postcards, advertising, and a small selection of parts.

Bidding on the literature was noteworthy. An early-1900s Huber "Light 4" pamphlet, "The Foundation of Tractor Dependability," brought \$200, while a 1971 John Deere dealer service binder scored \$110. A set of nine IH parts catalogs covering Farmall, International, and McCormick machines also grabbed \$110, showing these historic reference materials still hold plenty of appeal.

CHILLICOTHE, Ohio — This past summer, 4-H Clubs throughout Ohio collected a record-breaking 448,827 pounds of food to donate to more than 60 food banks across the state, all thanks to the "Fight Hunger, Stock the Trailer" competition. This program encourages youth to collect non-perishable food items and donate them to local food banks.

Competition in the state was divided by regions: South Region, Northeast Region, East Central Region, West Central Region and Northwest Region. The top county 4-H program in each region received \$5,000. Second in each received \$1,500 while third place in each region received \$500.

This year's overall winner was Ross County 4-H, which collected 122,640 pounds of food over the summer. Ross County competed in the South Ohio Region. Clermont County was County finished third.

That 122,640-pound total shattered expectations by Ross County 4-H leaders.

"When we first told people we were going for 100,000 pounds of nonperishables and water, people were really skeptical," said C.J. Jones, a member of the Ross County Junior Fair Board. "But when you work together and trust in God and have a lot of good, strong encouraging people around you, it helps a lot."

It also helps to have the county with the state's largest 4-H contingent.

"We're honored and excited to have led the state in the Fight Hunger, Stock the Trailer competition," said Ryan Kline, Ross County 4-H Youth Development Coordinator. "We partially owe this to the strong support from our community and our community partners. It's also attributed to deep roots of tradition here in our county as we have a lot of family members whose parents and grandparents were in 4-H. The tradition side of this has helped Ross County maintain strong programs."

Keeping 4-H in Ross County strong is the task of Kline, who is an alumnus of 4-H in this county.

"Prior to COVID-19, we had 74 4-H Clubs and just over 1,600 members.

- Pour from the poll back to the withers and then from the tailhead to the middle of the back. If you miss covering the area from the withers to the middle of the back, that is fine. Lice tend to be near the head, shoulders and tailhead. Be sure to get the product down on the skin. Spraying the product on the cow's side as she runs past you is not adequate.

4. Pregnancy Check

If you have a spring calving herd and you have not pregnancy checked yet, "Get 'R Done." An open cow eats your hay and gives you nothing in return. ters and fostering the same values of dedication, family and faith that shaped their upbringing.

Second and third place honorees for the 2025 Outstanding Young Farm Family Award are Brandon and Taylor Henning, of Breckinridge County, and Adam and Kelsey Roberts, of Harding County.

To be nominated for the Kentucky Farm Bureau Outstanding Young Farmers award, farmers must meet three criteria.

First, the young farmers must have active involvement in production agriculture. The majority of the farmer's income must be derived from farming activities. Second, applicants must be between the ages of 18 and 35 and a member of the county farm bureau. Finally, applications must be received by specified deadline, which is typically set by the Kentucky Farm Bureau.

Judges then evaluate the application and conduct an on-farm interview to confirm the applicant's involvement and achievements in agriculture.



COLUMBIA. Tenn.—The University of Tennessee Institute of Agriculture (UTIA) and Tennessee Farm Bureau Federation have revamped the Tennessee Farmer-of-the-Year program. The program will honor the state's agricultural history across all three regions of Tennessee while recognizing the state's an outstanding job on their farm, and university and look forward to how this top farmers.

We have been looking for ways to bring even more attention to agriculture and to the good farmers that we have across the state," said Rob Holland, Director of the UT Center for Profitable Agriculture. "We want to bring awareness to the importance of full-time farmers. We want to recognize farmers who do

we want to reward their commitment to excellence."

From 1990 through 2024, UT Extension honored Tennessee farmers through a regional Farmer-of-the-Year competition. Beginning in 2026, Tennessee Farm Bureau and UT Extension have collaborated to recognize outstanding farmers from East, Middle, and West Tennessee, honoring their leadership, innovation, and contributions to the state's agricultural prominence. From these three regional honorees, one exemplary producer will be named Farmer-of-the-Year.

The Tennessee state flag has three stars, and those three stars represent the three Grand Divisions of the state, East, Middle, and West, explained Lee Maddox, Director, Communications Div., TN Farm Bureau Federation.

"There are some subtle differences in what the agriculture economy is in each division, but you can be sure that all 95 counties in Tennessee have some type of agriculture," Maddox said. "Each county has some cattle and row crops."

Entering the contest will be through an application process, Holland said. Farmers will be asked to send in a thorough application about their farming operation, their background, and what they do. The selection committee will review those applications and select the three Grand Division winners. The committee will pay an onsite visit to those winners and then select the Farmer-ofthe-Year.

"It is important to recognize our farmers," Maddox said. "It is our most important industry in the state: it is really the most important industry in the country. Our farmers produce the good food, fiber, and fuel that we as Americans completely depend upon and enjoy.

"We are proud to partner with the

program continues to elevate our most important industry," he said. "We are looking for somebody who is dedicated to that job of protecting the natural resources, of looking at innovative ways to produce food, fiber, and fuel, and someone that enjoys doing this for a living."

Applications to be named Tennessee Farmer of the Year are now open and must be submitted no later than March 1, 2026. Forms and complete details are available online at the website tnfarmbureau.org/tennessee-farmer-of-the-year.

Applicants must be at least 21 years old and must claim a crop, livestock or production enterprise constituting a full-time farm operation as their primary source of income.

Regional finalists will be selected following the close of nominations. The overall state winner will be named following farm visits by a steering committee of UTIA and Farm Bureau representatives, as well as representatives from affiliated agencies including Tennessee State University and the Tennessee Department of Agriculture.

Two regional finalists will each be awarded a cash prize of \$5,000, and the remaining finalist will be named the Tennessee Farmer of the Year.


The Tennessee Farmer of the Year will receive a Can-Am Defender HD11 XT CAB (value of \$30,000) and an all-expense-paid trip for two to the American Farm Bureau Convention in January 2027. All finalists will be recognized and expected to attend the awards ceremony scheduled for June 13, 2026, in Franklin, Tennessee.

Northwest Indiana pig farmer discusses labor shortage, changes in hog industry

WEST LAFAYETTE, Ind. - Today's hog industry is dealing with a shortage of labor and fewer farms, a northwest Indiana pig farmer said recently.

Brian Martin, a fifth-generation farmer, talked about the industry and how things have changed over the last 30 years or so during the Nov. 18 Purdue Commercial AgCast.

He said labor is the industry's biggest need.

"Through the last 10 years - and part of that is because the rural workforce (has) a lot of pressure on it, unemployment's low - (there) seems to be fewer people that truly want a job and that's resulted in us, the industry, becoming a lot more active in immigrant workers. The visa that is used in our industry predominantly is TN Visa, which is a college graduate from could be Eastern Europe, could be from Africa, could be from Mexico.

"We are 80 percent employed. Our employees are TN Visa, which is a three-to-five year. And it puts you into a whole different process of finding people. The good thing is you're finding folks that are looking for opportunity, that want to come to work, that are leaving a place and seeing a broad horizon in front of them."

Martin said with foreign workers, the farm's turnover rate has moved from near 80 percent annually to 30 percent over the last six years, and that comes with improved production. Disease events can influence that, he said, but overall, their labor force is much more stable.

"We focus a lot on the number of our team who exceed one year with us," Martin explained. "We want that number to continually rise, and we've seen that be successful through time with them. We work hard at cross training so everyone sees the vision, understands across the system (the) why and how, and what a victory really looks like."

The biggest change in the pork industry and beyond pork, such as in grain, is the number of farms has decreased through time, he said. Indiana is definitely independent oriented, so farmers would think only in their realm and wouldn't think about potential partnerships outside of just being independent folks, Martin said.

"I'll give credit to dad and folks ahead of me, as we think collaboratively. Here's a good example, I was 17, dad went to his neighbor and said, 'I don't want to plant this year. Let's partner and you provide this, I'll provide that, and we'll do it all together.' Same idea as what we've done in pig farming through the years is look for wonderful partners, grow in it and then feed off of the strengths."

Consolidation has made the industry smaller. Martin noted. It has become a small enough industry that if you name the top 40 companies, have connections, he said.

ple know each other by reputation, Martin said, adding collaboration is pretty easy, which is a nice thing about it. That connects people much differently than it did 30 years ago, he pointed out.

Martin offered advice to students who might be interested in working on a hog farm or potentially owning one in the future. He recommended trying a broad spectrum of things to better find their comfort spot in what they want to do.

"So I guess ultimately I'm saying diverse internships for kids while they're in school," Martin said. "(They should take) opportunities to establish as many and broad relationships as they can, so knowing lots of people. (Purdue's job fairs) are obviously an opportunity to be exposed to big industry, from drug companies to packing companies to production companies, so that there's plenty of diverse opportunity to meet people, set up different experiences, and then find the one that clicks, or the ones that click, and go do it."

ble digits, including an Allis-Chalmers MD5 dozer operator's and repair manual that hit \$50. Later, a John Deere 4320 tractor technical manual hit \$45. Bids in the teens won a trio of Aultman-Taylor postcards profiling 30-60 gas tractors (\$17.50) and an instruction book for Minneapolis Steel & Machinery Twin City 12-20 and 20-35 tractors (\$15). Single-digits grabbed items like a six-piece set of JD operator's manuals (\$8) and a double-sided Allis-Chalmers No. 7 side-delivery rake & tedder advertisement (\$5).

On Friday, it was farm toys and memorabilia, with both live and online bidding available. Over 1,000 lots crossed the block, including a rare new-in-box Toy Tractor Times 25th Anniversary Edition 1/16-scale AgcoStar 8360 4WD tractor with floater/fat tires, which hit \$2,400. Four additional diecasts sold for four figures, including a boxed 1/8-scale Deere 4020 diesel wide-front (\$1,500) and two limited-edition 1/16-scale Die-Cast Promotions Big Bud 16V-747 4WD tractors (\$1,500 each).

Three-figure offers scored standouts like a used Lincoln Toys Oliver 77 wide-front that reached \$450, and a new-in-box 1/16-scale Ertl International 7488 dealer edition at \$300. A unique scratch-built metal and wood Advance Rumely steam engine tractor captured \$275.

Even with winning bids below \$100, buyers snagged quality pieces. A good-condition brass 1/16th Scale Models steel-wheeled Farmall M, part of the Joseph Ertl Collector Series, went for \$80. A 1/16-scale SpecCast Allis-Chalmers Model K crawler in its original box pulled \$50, while a good-condition 1/16-scale SpecCast Oliver 880 narrow-front went for just \$15.

Saturday marked another shift, with a "drive-thru" live auction alongside online bidding on a wide array of antique and vintage tractors, collector trucks, antique cars, pedal vehicles, signs, and other advertising.

A total of 455 lots were offered, led by a \$100,000 offer for a 1910 Hart-Parr Model 22-45. This rare, running survivor - a standout of early tractor history - featured a two-cylinder hit-andmiss engine, single forward and reverse speeds, belt pulley, drawbar, buzz-coil battery ignition, canopy, and reinforced heavy-duty wheels and gears.

Coming in second at \$47,000 was a 1972 International Harvester 1468, powered by a rebuilt V8 diesel and new torque amplifier. The machine featured a 4-speed transmission with high/low ranges, 540/1000 PTO, dual hydraulic remotes, 3-point hitch with top link, drawbar, chrome stacks, front/rear weights, easy on/off steps, and many new components.

Less meteoric bids won machinery like a 1934 Oliver Hart-Parr 18-28 Orchard, which sold for \$10,500. Fully restored in 2006, it featured a rebuilt 4-cylinder gas engine, 3-speed transmission, orchard fenders with frontwheel covers, model-correct magneto and carburetor, rubber on steel wheels, and a custom canvas cover. A 1959 Oliver 770 diesel Wheatland with only 33 post-restoration hours got \$6,500. Powered by a 6-cylinder engine and 6-speed transmission with power booster for 12 speeds, it included a 540 PTO, hydraulic remotes, drawbar, and new tires.

Ag machines weren't the day's only draw, as classic vehicles were also on the block. Leading the group was a 1971 Chevrolet Blazer "restomod." which drove off for \$44,500. Powered by an LS 5.3L V8 with a 700R4 4-speed automatic, the highly customized restoration featured a converted 1968 front clip, limited-slip rear end, 3.08:1 final drive, 4-wheel disc brakes, and modern touches such as Omega Kustom digital gauges and Riddler wheels.

An original collector-grade 1996 Ford Bronco XLT with just 37,500 miles went for \$39,000. Powered by a 5.8L EFI V8, 4-speed automatic, and factory 4WD with automatic locking hubs, it featured original green two-tone paint and matching removable hardtop - one of only 44 with that combination. Well-maintained, it included complete service records and a deluxe Marti Report.

Other classics attracted offers under \$10,000, including a running-condition 1934 Chevrolet 1.5-ton stake bed truck with 31,142 miles, an inline six and manual transmission, that hammered at \$6,500. A 1983 Ford F150 XL 4x4 with 76,000 miles left for \$4,500. That was powered by a 400HP 351 V8 installed in 2017, with a Jasper remanufactured automatic transmission added in 2025. Well equipped, it sported factory 4WD with automatic locking hubs, dual gas tanks, and amenities like power steering, power brakes, and cruise control.

Saturday also presented an opportunity to snag a special holiday gift, with more than 80 quality pedal vehicles available. Those included a Hoover International T-340 Crawler by Hoover Promotions netting \$3,500, and a custom John Deere pedal crawler with blade (one of only 5 built) finished at \$2,500. Others sold from \$100 for a vintage AMF "Big 4" chain drive wide-front to \$2,000 for a Caterpillar pedal dozer with a custom flame paint job.

Taken together, the three days - spanning literature to machinery - reflected current market interest and where values continue to stay strong.







Thanksgiving Dinner 5 percent lower this year from 2024

WASHINGTON, D.C. – According to the American Farm Bureau Federation (AFBF)'s 40th Annual Thanksgiving Dinner Survey, the cost of this year's feast was 5 percent lower from 2024, marking the third straight year of price declines.

"Our members have been reporting prices for 40 years," Faith Parum, AFBF economist, told Farm World. "The largest change (over the years) is most of them shop online now. Our survey lets the shopper decide if they want to visit in-store, or they can navigate to their local grocery store of choice to look up the items. Other than that, it is the same basket and quantities."

The annual survey provides a snapshot of the average cost of Thanksgiving staples that make up a classic holiday feast for 10, which is \$55.18, or about \$5.52 per person, federation officials said in a Nov. 19 news release.

"This is a 5 percent decrease from 2024," officials said. "Three years of declines don't fully erase dramatic increases that led to a record-high cost of \$64.05 in 2022. The centerpiece on most Thanksgiving tables – the turkey – dramatically decreased in price, which helped bring down the overall cost of dinner.

"The average price for a 16-pound frozen turkey is \$21.50," officials added. "That is \$1.34 per pound, down more than 16 percent from last year.

While the wholesale price for fresh turkey is up from 2024, grocery stores are featuring Thanksgiving deals and attempting to draw consumer demand back to turkey, leading to lower retail prices for a holiday bird."

According to the survey, AFBF volunteer shoppers checked prices the first week of November. Grocery stores often feature whole turkeys at even lower prices in the days leading up to Thanksgiving. In fact, the most recent USDA Agricultural Marketing Service data said the average per-pound feature price for whole frozen turkeys declined further during the second week of November.

"It's encouraging to see some relief in the price of turkeys, as it is typically the most expensive part of the meal," Parum said in the news release. "Farmers are still working to rebuild turkey flocks that were devastated by avian influenza, but overall demand has also fallen. The combination will help ensure turkey will remain an affordable option for families celebrating Thanksgiving."

The shopping list for AFBF's survey included turkey, stuffing, sweet potatoes, rolls, peas, cranberries, a veggie tray and pumpkin pie with whipped cream, all in quantities sufficient for 10 servings, officials said. Half the ingredients in the survey declined in price, including dinner rolls and stuffing. Low wheat prices helped bring down the cost of items requiring flour, officials added.

The survey showed other items such as 14 ounces of cubed stuffing mix was \$3.71 (down 9 percent); two frozen pie crusts: \$3.37 (down 8 percent); and one dozen dinner rolls, \$3.56 (down 14.6 percent). But the survey showed items like fresh vegetables and sweet potatoes increased: a veggie tray was up more than 61 percent and sweet potatoes were up 37 percent, with natural disasters partly contributing to the increase.

For example, North Carolina, which

is the largest grower of the nation's sweet potatoes, suffered hurricane damage, according to the survey: "We've seen a reduction in prices for about half our items," Parum told Farm World. "Frozen turkey prices are down, and this year, the turkey is the smallest share of the bill than ever before. This shows that our sides are moving more into the spotlight.

"In that vein, we see high volatility of produce prices," she added. "Sweet potatoes and the veggie tray are up this year due to natural disasters, transportation costs, and labor shortages. However, because these prices are volatile, shoppers may see lower prices in their own stores."

In recognition of changes in Thanksgiving dinner traditions, officials said the AFBF survey also included boneless ham, Russet potatoes and frozen green beans, in an expanded menu. Adding these foods to the classic Thanksgiving menu increases the overall cost by \$21.91, to \$77.09.

The survey, however, indicated the continued shortage of farm workers and rapidly increasing farm wages also played a role in rising produce costs: "It's important to note that fresh vegetables and potatoes are traditionally low-cost items, so an increase of just a few cents can dramatically affect the cost change percentage year-to-year," officials said.

This year's national average cost was calculated using surveys completed with pricing data from all 50 states, and Puerto Rico. AFBF analysis revealed regional differences in the cost of the meal. The cost for the classic Thanksgiving meal was the most affordable in the South at \$50.01, followed by the Midwest at \$54.38; the Northeast at \$60.82; and the West at \$61.75.

In addition, the expanded meal (e.g., classic meal plus boneless ham, Russet potatoes and green beans) was the most affordable in the South at \$71.20: the Midwest at \$76.33; the Northeast at \$82.97; and most expensive in the West at \$84.97, the survey indicated.

"We are blessed to live in a country that is capable of producing such an abundant food supply, and for that we should be thankful," said Zippy Duvall, AFBF president. "Despite modest declines in the cost of a Thanksgiving meal, I know food prices are a real concern for many families, including in rural America.

"We lost 15,000 farms last year because of factors including historically low crop prices, high supply costs and trade uncertainty, which continue to squeeze farmers and ranchers," he said. "Every farm lost is another step toward consolidation and reliance on other countries for our food.

"We urge Congress to address the challenging economic conditions facing farmers to ensure farm families can continue growing the food we all rely on, not just on Thanksgiving, but every day of the year," he added.

Turkey survives protecting flock from dog attack

OXFORD, Ohio -A turkey has gone viral after some fowl play involving a dog.

Nearly 3.5 million views appeared on TikTok as word about Thomas the turkey survived a dog attack, protecting other animals at a farm near Oxford, Ohio.

Thomas' owner Cara Zellers says Thomas was bitten twice while protecting the family's other animals during the attack, including ducks, chickens and his mate Gamora, another turkey.

"Stepped into hero mode. It was fight or flight, and Thomas stepped up to the task," said Dr. Chantel Raghu, veterinarian and co-owner of Oxford Veterinary Hospital. "Thomas was likely trying to protect ducks and chickens from the dog and was bitten badly in the process."

"I had just gotten home that day and saw a dog running through our yard," said owner Cara Zellers. "My first instinct was to search for my two-year-old turkey, Thomas."

Zellers found Thomas hiding in the garage. The other animals in the yard were safe.

"It was a terrifying time for all of us as Thomas is a special bird to our family," Zellers said. "He's a big part of our family as he waits for us at the door when we come home."

The staff at the veterinary clinic said Thomas was very patient as he was sedated in order to have his wound looked at a few days before Thanksgiving.

"The wound he sustained and how brave and kind he was to us as we were taking care of him...he's a really sweet animal," Raghu said.

And seeing a turkey enter the clinic doors was a first for Raghu.

"I've had a variety of animals come into my clinic, but this is the first turkey we've seen," Raghu said. "We've seen other types of farm animals such as ducks, geese, pigs and chickens. And or course, many dogs and cats. But never a turkey."

The biggest worry was that of infection from bacteria, which is why you can't immediately close up the would from a dog bite right away," Raghu said. "Dog saliva contains lots of bacteria. It's best to flush it out as much as you can to clean it out. We had to make the tissue as healthy as possible before closing the wound."

"Thomas went back home the day before Thanksgiving," Raghu said. "He's doing well and very resilient."

Thomas has several treatments ahead of him, but Raghu says he should fully recover from these injuries.

"We're looking forward to taking Tom to Bass Pro Shops to meet Santa Claus later this month," Zellers said.

TDA launches online hub connecting vets with farming resources

NASHVILLE, Tenn. – According to the 2022 Census of Agriculture, 15 percent of the 3.2 million farmers and ranchers in the United States are veterans. In Tennessee, 9,900 farms are operated by a veteran producer.

With this in mind, the Tennessee Department of Agriculture (TDA) rolled out a one-stop shop of online resources to help veterans in the Volunteer State who are looking to get into farming. The webpage connects veteran farmers with education materials, training and funding opportunities to either start or grow their agriculture operations.

"Whether it is livestock, fruit and vegetable production, anything in the range of agriculture, we've got resources for that here," said Kacey Troup, a TDA business consultant. "It's all housed here in one location, easy to find, easy to navigate, and it will connect them to all of the different resources that they're going to need to be successful."

Troup said veteran resources have been around for countless years. However, there wasn't a central hub for it all, making it more difficult for veterans to get their journey started or expand their current operations.

"All of these things existed, they just were having trouble finding them," Troup said. "We wanted to create one place that connects all of the different puzzle pieces together, so they are easy to find in one location."

Under the TDA's Military Veteran Farmers page, veterans will see a welcome video followed by six dropdown menus. There vets will find in-

formation on permitting, education, agricultural grants, Tennessee state veteran benefits, Tennessee state agricultural networks and veteran farmer testimonials.

"Starting an agriculture business has a lot of components, and transitioning out of military service has a lot of components as well," Troup said. "Being able to house these in a way where information is easily accessible without being overwhelming, I think it's one of the biggest benefits of this page."

Ron Bridges, president of the Farmer Veteran Coalition of Tennessee, said these resources are an investment in farmland across the state. He said the state is losing more farmland by the year, so helping veterans get into agriculture is one way to mitigate these losses.

"We've got people coming out of the military who have perhaps a source of income, retirement, disability pay, or something that could help offset the cost of getting started in farming," Bridges said. "Helping veterans get on the farms in one way to help save Tennessee farmland."

Bridges is an army veteran himself. He said farming and veterans are very much intertwined.

"There are a large number of veterans getting out who are looking for a new mission in life, and the ability to go from serving your country in terms of being in military service to serving your country by producing food is a perfect match," Bridges said. "There's a lot of overlap between the qualities and characteristics you need to be a good soldier or a good sailor or airman and being a good farmer."

Kevin Jacobi, an Air Force veteran who served 32 years, is another ex-

ample of a vet who looked to farming after his service. Jacobi made his choice to farm while he was overseas. When he returned to the states, he reached out to the TDA for assistance.

"The idea to farm was born in north Africa where I was in the Air Force at the time," Jacobi said. "I told myself I wasn't going to be an executive of some kind like my buddies, rather I wanted to farm, and my goal was to supply food for local people."

Today, Jacobi raises pasture-raised eggs, chicken, pork and lamb at Land Basket Farm in Russellville, Tenn.

"There are a lot of attributes that a lot of veterans carry just from their training in the service," he said. "Things like trustworthiness, honesty and transparency, just to name a few. These types of attributes have served me well and I feel I'm a trusted source for folks around here."

Another veteran-owned farm, this

one operated by vet Mark Bowen, got started in 1999 in Lenoir City. Bowen started Meadowdale Farm from scratch and concentrates on pasture-raised poultry and meats, eggs, hay and forest products. Outside of their products, they offer one and two-day workshops where veterans can learn about farming operations.

"It's a way I can continue to serve, but serve my local community, and knowing that those people are there to help and be supportive has been just wonderful," Bowen said. "Having a local source and a community that you know and trust is really important."

Mark and his wife, Kate, are members of the Farmer Veteran Coalition and served on the board of the Windham County Farm Bureau. Mark got into farming 20 years ago when he left active duty and quickly began researching food systems and where they come from.

"I just thought we could do it a little better and raise the healthiest, most nutrient-dense food that we possibly could ourselves and to help feed my family," Mark said. "My wife and son both have a chronic illness, so having the highest quality food was really important to us.

"It's really nice to know that somebody's got our back here at home, too. We've gotten the resources and the help that we need so that I can continue farming. Many veterans come back from war with disabilities of different types, different amounts, and it's great just to know that somebody is there to help them."



December brings sunset at its earliest time of the year

The Thanksgiving, with its reliable bounty, its reunions, its hours of perfumed air, is over, and the raking, the planting of bulbs, and the digging of root crops are finished for the year. The freezer and pantry shelves are as full as they are going to be: What we have done, we have done; and what we have left undone, we have left undone. — Jane Kenyon

The Moon in December

The Moon: The Moon is full on December 5

The Moon enters its last quarter on December 14

The Moon is new on December 20 The Moon enters its second quarter on December 27

Sun Time: On December 2, the Sun reaches its earliest setting of the year in much of the Lower Midwest, and it continues to set at the same time for 12 days.

Star Time: Orion is the most obvious of all the star groups, and around him cluster some of the easiest stars to identify. Leading Orion into winter is red Aldebaran, the eye of Taurus. In front of Taurus, the seven sisters of the Pleiades lie almost in the center of the sky. Above the Hunter's raised arms, Capella is the largest light in Auriga. Above and behind Orion, Castor and Pollux, the brightest stars of Gemini mark the east. Trailing along in the southeast is Sirius, the giant Dog Star.

Weather Trends: The high pressure system that typically arrives at the end of December's first week is a major pivot for severe weather throughout the states along the 40th Parallel. A secondary front often increases the assault on your homestead between the 11th and the 13th.

Zeitgebers: Events in Nature that Tell the Time of Year: When sunset reaches its earliest time of the year, the brittle leaves of the pear trees

> fall. This is the time during which the second bloom of forsythia flowers ends, when witch hazel blossoms wither, and the last of the golden beeches, the

willows, osage and oaks come down. Even though this is one more week of endings, it is not a week of stasis. Spruces are growing new needles. Caraway and henbit sometimes flower in the sun, and a dandelion or a periwinkle opens in scattered fields and lawns. Fresh chickweed, which sprouted at the end of the summer, is blossoming in warm corners of the woods. Catnip sometimes grows back beside thistle, moneywort, chickweed, wild geranium, leafcup, henbit and yarrow.

Farm and Garden Time: Try to complete harvest of corn, soybeans and sugar beets before the arrival of early winter, which normally storms in with the second December front, bringing the first taste of snow to the Border States and often a major blizzard to the North. The Christmas tree harvest is well underway, and the last poinsettias have come north. In greenhouses and sunrooms, tomatoes sown in July will be getting ripe as December approaches. Marigolds, zinnias, impatiens and other bedding plants saved from the cold may still be flowering.

Mind and Body Time: The danger of Seasonal Affective Disorder increases as

the winter period of solar stability (December 5 – January 8) begins, keeping the days short and the amount of available sunlight. Be out of doors as much as possible to maximize exposure to light. The bright flourescent lights of malls and shopping centers may also be helpful.

Creature Time (for fishing, hunting, feeding, bird watching): Cold fronts that usually arrive around December 3 and 8 will be preceded by a dropping barometer, encouraging activity in fish and game. Honeysuckle foliage continues to fall, opening up the undergrowth for hikers and hunters. If you are bird watching, set out additional feeders for suet and fruit as well as for seeds and grains. Keep track of the types of birds that arrive in your yard. Be ready for late and early migrants.

Journal

December 4, 1992: To the woods this afternoon, cloudy, 40 degrees, light breeze: Clover foliage keeping the paths green, with some dandelions, some plantain. Wind in the dry grass, oak leaves rustling, distant crows intermittent, no other birds for the first miles. Then the scream of a robin as though he were frightened or had been attacked.

Moss was still bright beside me, became the dominant green in the woods. A few red raspberry leaves at the top of the hill, an occasional bank of honey-suckle berries. Nettles, protected by wild roses, were growing back in the valley, a foot tall. Top sweet gum seed balls were holding on. Teasel was dark in the dull goldenrod fields.

Osage fruts all yellow on the ground. Pale greens and pastels of the lichens. Then the landscape down the valley: bands of grays and browns above a sky of light stratus clouds. The trees black,

pasture chartreuse: a cross section of the winter, veins of this time. Walnut hulls stained the wood purple. Coming back, I saw a pair of flickers; they screeched then flew west off toward the river. At my summer fishing hole, three tan moths, between half an inch and an inch wingspan, struggled through the cold. I cast my line out there: only one bite.

Today, the pieces of the last season become fragments of a new season, Early Winter, the first season of the new year.

The Ohio Coon Dog Field Trials By Pete Jones, Lynn, IN

My life as a young boy was much different than the lives of most of my friends. Most of them spent Sunday in Sunday School and church. I spent my Sundays working at the Ohio Coon Dog Field Trials.

My dad built an electric generator with a gas engine for power. It would run his sound system in places where there was no electricity available.

My job was to climb trees and help place two large steel speakers in them. I would help string wire from the speakers to the sound systems. Dad could then make announcements about the trials or play music from a recorded player.

The trials were always held in the woods. Men would go about a mile away and drag a sack of coon manure over the ground. They would take the sack up to a tree where a coon would be tied to a lower limb.

The trial would be over when the first dog would tree the coon by looking up at the coon and barking at him.

Yes, there was a lot of money bet on the dogs. The first to tree the coon won all the money for his owner.

The last good thing I remember about the Coon Dog Field Trials was our picnic lunch. It consisted of a pork chop sandwich with green onions, a cold six-ounce Coca Cola and custard pie. I cherish these memories.



No autonomous tractor sales in Sweden

International trucks and tractors.

He's maintained a friendship with the current Case IH distributor, who has provided me with this update on the Swedish tractor market:

It's a significantly different market than the U.S. Electric tractor sales, for instance, are far apart. In the U.S., dairy operations, vineyards and fruit farms have started using electric autonomous tractors, largely because of labor shortages. In Sweden, there are no sales.

Part of the cause of this is legal. Another is the plentiful labor supply.

The same lack of demand exists in alternate fuel engines. They are on test in Sweden but not yet on the retail market. Methane power (such as New Holland) is in the test stage only.

Alternative diesel demand is growing. However, it is still too expensive to reach large-volume sales. No autonomous sales vet exist in Sweden. Some legal issues must be addressed first.

Sweden is a substantial tractor market, however, and has been a very progressive one through the years.

Volvo electric wheel loader

Volvo has released the L90 electric wheel loader, which should be popular in large feedlots. Dedicated electric motors for propulsion and hydraulics enable full available power for both systems.

US tractor shipments... high point

Heritage Magazine recently researched past American trac-

tor shipments at their all-time high. The year was 1951, and the total was 567,446. (It was eight years later before total tractors on U.S. farms would outnumber draft horses.)

These high numbers were never again reached. By 1960, the annual total had dropped to 152,878 and never would future numbers go above that.

A huge collection, now smaller

One little lamb will live forever in our hearts. We never knew what caused Angel to be unable to stand on her own four legs. We gave the poor thing a bottle three times a day for three weeks, but we were gradually losing her. Usually I reluctantly took care of euthanizing our dying creatures, but this is the one animal I never could bring myself to do it. To this day I often blame myself and wonder if we'd have given Angel one more week maybe she would have found her footing in life.

There was carnage and whip cream everywhere. After such an escape there was only one way we could lure Pancakes back into her pen and that was to bribe her with some of my mom's pancakes.

One of the highlights of my life these days is eat lunch monthly with a rancher I've known since college. Tiny is a big man with an even bigger heart but at our last visit Tiny looked exhausted but with good reason: he had five calves on the bottle.

It's hard to ignore a polka-dot hill on a sunny day.

Imagine it: a black cow here, a brown one there, a black-and-white one there and there and there against impossibly green grass with a vivid blue sky. If you can see

it in your mind's eye, well, you know. And you also know there's more to a cow than its color, and in "Barn Gothic" by Ryan Dennis, there's more to a farmer than his cows.

He was meant to be a fourth-generation farmer.

When he was 10, Ryan Dennis woke

up before the sun to follow his father to the barn, to milk their

were also meant to teach: the hope was that one day. Dennis would take over his grandfather's farm right next door on a hill in upstate New York. But then one quick event changed the course of their lives: Dennis's grandfather was working in the milk parlor and fell to the concrete floor, hitting his head,

sustaining a quiet brain injury. A stoic, financially daring man before the fall, his behavior worsened. He began spending money he didn't have.

The family noticed but they thought everything was fine. Rollercoaster milk prices, predatory lending and government policies had always meant that the Dennis men struggled and adjusted. But getting loans for equipment started to become impossible; planting crops, difficult. Dennis went away to college and his father worried that he'd never return to the farm.

The worries escalated when Dennis's father sustained a life-threatening skidder injury, and nearly died. But that pain was nothing compared to the hurt that was to come...

Anybody who's ever been stepped on by a cow knows how it feels: not fun. But trust this: what you'll read inside "Barn Gothic" will stomp your heart just as flat.

Here's a hard, hard story to read, wrapped inside tales that are joyful and awe-struck. Dennis shares the spotlight here with his father, grandfather, neighbors, the land they loved, and the act of farming itself. Readers in the know will recognize the unique pleasures he writes about - tending the fields, harvesting them, and knowing the cows - but they'll also gulp hard at what ultimately happens here. It's an ending that might be altogether too familiar. It will pull you up hard and make you think deeply about the things we do to survive and how we manage to forgive.

"Barn Gothic" is a good heartfelt read for anyone who thinks about our nation's farmers today, or who eats, drinks milk or derives pleasure from a good farm scape along the road. If you're a family farmer now or once upon a time, you'll find it spot-on.



The National Weather Service 8-14 day forecast, ending Dec. 8, called for "likely above" normal outlook for both temperature and an outlook for

an outlook for "leaning above" normal precipitation. Unfortunately, all the weather people I watch are saying the same thing, likely cold and wet for now and most of the meteorogical winter of December through February. Even The Old Farmer's Almanac for their Region 6, (our area of what they call the Lower Great Lakes region) is saying likely

snow and cold during these months.

Dec. 21 is the first day of winter but also the winter solstice, the "shortest day" of the year. For Ida, Mich., we will have 9:07:35 of daylight, with sunrise at 7:58 EST and sunset at 5:06pm. The good news is the days then get longer for the next six months until the summer solstice on June 21, when Ida will have 15:13:53 of daylight, with sunrise at 5:59 am DST and sunset at 9:13 pm.

MSU soybean variety trial results are out with the southeast Michigan location in Lenawee County, at the Jason Woods farm, showing good yields. The Roundup Ready (RR) early trial had yields ranging from 93.8 to 73.1 while the RR late trial had yields ranging from 96.7 to 83.6

bushels per acre. The conventional herbicide trial had yields ranging from 98.1 to 64.9 bushels per acre. Results are available at www.MSUvarietytrials.edu.

Corn variety trial results are now available for the Ohio State location at the OSU OARDC location at Hoytville (think Bowling Green). Very dry weather resulted in lower yields than other northwest trial locations. For early maturity hybrids, yields ranged from 167.7 to 124.7 bushels per acre, and for the full season maturity hybrids, yields ranged from 173.9 down to 105.7 bushels. OSU also publishes a two-year and a three-year summary of hybrid performance and a listing of all the seed fungicide and insecticide treatments and technology traits for the 2025 trial. Search Google for 2025 OSU corn variety trial. Unfortunately, Michigan State discontinued their corn and corn silage trials in 2023.

2026 Illinois crop budgets for corn, soybean and wheat projected by the University of Illinois for a Northern Illinois farm return of -\$64 per acre for corn (following soybeans) and a +\$3 return for soybeans (following corn). There are additional budget projections for highly and lower productive Central Illinois farms and for Southern Illinois. There are many income and expense item variables that can affect individual farms differently than the projections.

Not letting bugs feel at home inside the house can be challenging and maybe non-stop. Common bugs to look for include ants (particularly Carpenter ants), cockroaches, earwigs, flies, house centipedes, silverfish, stink bugs, spiders and boxelder bugs. Tiny gaps around the doors, cracks or holes in the siding and even pets with hitchhiking insects can allow bugs indoor access. Other suggestions include cleaning up the kitchen and under the sink, clean and sweep regularly, dry out damp areas around sinks, dish and clothes washers, not stacking up firewood inside the house or attached garage or even against the house. Ready-to-use pesticides, including baits and aerosols, can create a bug barrier and some are labeled for inside the home around doors, windows, along baseboards, under the sink, etc. Trapping insects in empty water bottles, or even using a fly swatter are possible non-pesticide helps.




